Have you ever heard the voice of the Lord? How do you know that God is speaking?

Two guys decide to go ice fishing. They head out, find a nice spot, cut a hole in the ice, and stick in their poles. Suddenly, a loud voice booms from above, "THERE ARE NO FISH HERE!"

The two guys look around, look at each other, and look up, and they don't see anyone. They figure the voice knows what it's talking about, so they get up and find another spot on the ice, cut a hole, and stick in their poles. Once again, the voice booms from above, "THERE ARE NO FISH HERE!"

They look around, look at each other, then look up. Again, they don't see anyone. They find another spot on the ice, cut a hole, and stick in their poles. Once again, the loud voice booms from above, "THERE ARE NO FISH HERE!"

They look around, look at each other, then look up, again seeing no one. One of them calls out, "Is this GOD??"

The voice responds, "NO! THIS IS THE SKATING RINK MANAGER! THERE ARE NO FISH HERE!"

Yeah. Identifying God's voice is a little difficult.

Jesus hears a voice from the heavens just after he is baptized by his cousin John. The Gospel says, "A voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." What a wonderful affirmation for Jesus and those within earshot!

Through Scripture, we know that God spoke to many people— Moses, Abraham, Samuel, and Elijah are just a few. He spoke to saints like Francis of Assisi and Joan of Arc, but those were pretty special people and circumstances. Is it possible that God still speaks to his people?

I truly believe that God speaks to us, but audibly? It hasn't happened to me. Your experience may be different, but I haven't heard that voice from the heavens. How do we hear God speaking?

When we have a relationship with anyone, we communicate. Think of all the ways we "speak" to each other these days: email, texts, Facebook, Instagram, Snap Chat, Skype, telephone, and, sometimes, even in person. When we pray, we communicate with God, and, if we're listening, he replies to us. But are the thoughts we have during prayer our own thoughts? How do we know the voice we're hearing is his?

The closer our contact is with God, the more we will be able to know which voice is his. It gives us peace. St. Francis de Sales said, "No thoughts which cause us disquiet and agitation come from God who is Prince of Peace; they are, rather, temptations of the enemy, and therefore we must reject them and take no notice of them.'

The key here is perseverance. If we keep building a relationship with him, we will hear him speak to us. And wouldn't it be just about the best thing in the world to hear, "With you, I am well pleased"? Wow.

THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY WITH POPE FRANCIS

We will entrust the life of the Church, all humanity, and the entire cosmos to the Lordship of Christ, asking him to pour out his mercy upon us like the morning dew, so that everyone may work together to build a brighter future. How much I desire that the year to come will be steeped in mercy, so that we can go out to every man and woman, bringing the goodness and tenderness of God! May the balm of mercy reach everyone, both believers and those far away, as a sign that the Kingdom of God is already present in our midst!



VATICAN CITY — When Pope Francis met with Vatican employees, mostly lay people with families, he asked them to do 10 things. The list sounded remarkably like suggestions for New Year's resolutions:

- "Take care of your spiritual life, your relationship with God, because this is the backbone of everything we do and everything we are."
- "Take care of your family life, giving your children and loved ones not just money, but most of all your time, attention and love."
- "Take care of your relationships with others, transforming your faith into life and your words into good works, especially on behalf of the needy."
- "Be careful how you speak, purify your tongue of offensive words, vulgarity and worldly decadence."
- "Heal wounds of the heart with the oil of forgiveness, forgiving those who have hurt us and medicating the wounds we have caused others."
- "Look after your work, doing it with enthusiasm, humility, competence, passion and with a spirit that knows how to thank the Lord."
- "Be careful of envy, lust, hatred and negative feelings that devour our interior peace and transform us into destroyed and destructive people."
- "Watch out for anger that can lead to vengeance; for laziness that leads to existential euthanasia; for pointing the finger at others, which leads to pride; and for complaining continually, which leads to desperation."
- "Take care of brothers and sisters who are weaker ... the elderly, the sick, the hungry, the homeless and strangers, because we will be judged on this."

SAINT OF THE WEEK January 16 St. Berard and Companions

Preaching the gospel is often dangerous work. Leaving one's homeland and adjusting to new cultures, governments and languages is difficult enough; but martyrdom caps all the other sacrifices.

In 1219 with the blessing of St. Francis, Berard left Italy with Peter, Adjute, Accurs, Odo and Vitalis to preach in Morocco. En route in Spain Vitalis became sick and commanded the other friars to continue their mission without him.

They tried preaching in Seville, then in Muslim hands, but made no converts. They went on to Morocco where they preached in the marketplace. The friars were immediately apprehended and ordered to leave the country; they refused. When they began preaching again, an exasperated sultan ordered them executed. After enduring severe beatings and declining various bribes to renounce their faith in Jesus Christ, the friars were beheaded by the sultan himself on January 16, 1220.

These were the first Franciscan martyrs. When Francis heard of their deaths, he exclaimed, "Now I can truly say that I have five Friars Minor!" Their relics were brought to Portugal where they prompted a young Augustinian canon to join the Franciscans and set off for Morocco the next year. That young man was Anthony of Padua. These five martyrs were canonized in 1481.

The deaths of Berard and his companions sparked a missionary vocation in Anthony of Padua and others. There have been many, many Franciscans who have responded to Francis' challenge. Proclaiming the gospel can be fatal, but that has not stopped the Franciscan men and women who even today risk their lives in many countries throughout the world.
