Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

St. Paul tells us today: "Only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us."

It's too extreme to talk about "real" dying, but let's talk about another way that we die to others.

My friend's sister recently had surgery on her knee, and walking was difficult for her. She did the recommended physical therapy, but, still, getting around wasn't easy.

Last month, when we had the Snowpocalypse, she and my friend worked out a plan with groceries. The sister also needed to get her mail. Located at the end of a steep driveway, the mail isn't easy to get in good weather, let alone 24 inches of snow on top of a layer of ice. Because an appointment delay, my friend was late, and her sister called to check. "I'm sorry, but I'm getting there. It's just taking longer than I first thought," my friend told her.

Her sister answered, "Don't worry about getting the mail. I already got it." My friend immediately became worried. "How?? You didn't walk down the hill, did you? Are you okay?"

The reply was this story: her sister decided that perhaps she could get the mail herself. When she started down the hill, she fell, landing on her backside, unable to get up again.

The sister lives on a rather busy road. A few minutes after she fell, a school bus stopped right in front of her driveway. The driver hopped out, full of concern, saying, "Are you okay? Are you hurt? Can I help you?" She admitted that she had fallen but was not injured while trying to get her mail. The young man retrieved the mail and helped my friend's sister up the hill and into the house, making sure she didn't need anything before he left.

What a great story, huh? But, wait. I'm not finished.

Early the next morning, the sister heard a commotion outside the house. The young man had returned with his friend who had a large truck equipped with a snow plow. You see, my friend's sister had tried unsuccessfully for days to get her driveway plowed. Because of the depth of the snow, her regular guy couldn't help. Without being asked, the bus driver came to her

He took a great risk the first day, stopping his school bus in the road. He might have lost his job because he left his route. Without thought of the consequences, the young man did the right thing. It was more important to help this older lady in need. He was willing to sacrifice himself and his job.

What is the right thing to do? I used to tell my kids, "You'll always know if it's the right thing to do if it's the hardest thing to do." How many times this week did we put others first? How many times did we do the right thing? It doesn't have to be a big thing. Putting your shopping cart back after shopping. Helping a mom with two babies in tow to get her groceries into the car.

We have to be conscious of these opportunities and take the time to make the best of them. It can be family and friends, but strangers need help, too. Take notice this week. Let's do the right thing.



SAINT OF THE WEEK Bl. Charles the Good Feast day: March 2 Birth: 1083

Death: 1127

In 1086, St. Canute, King of Denmark and father of Blessed Charles the Good, was slain in St. Alban's Church, Odence. Charles who was only a few years old was taken by his mother to the court of Robert, Count of Flanders, his maternal grandfather. When he grew up, he became a knight and accompanied Robert in a crusade to the Holy Land where he distinguished himself; on their return, Charles also fought against the English with his uncle. On Robert's death, his son Baldwin succeeded him and designated Charles as the heir. At the same time, he arranged for Charles' marriage to the daughter of the Count of Clermont. During Baldwin's rule, Charles was closely associated with him, and the people came to have a high regard for his wise and beneficent ways as well as his personal holiness. At Baldwin's death, in 1119, the people made his cousin their ruler. Charles ruled his people with wisdom, diligence, and compassion; he made sure that times of truce were respected and fought against black marketeers who horded food and were waiting to sell it at astronomical prices to the people. This encouraged their undying wrath and one day in 1127 as Charles was praying in the Church of St. Donatian they set upon him and killed him. Blessed Charles the Good feast day is March 2nd.

Can we donate our bodies or have them cremated?

Can I donate my body to science after death? What about cremation?

Some find Catholic funerals odd. We sprinkle the deceased with holy water and bless the body with incense. We pray over burial sites and put a white cloth over the caskets. If a person is dead, why do we care about the "empty shell?"

Many Christians think God is only concerned with our souls, Scripture has a surprising amount of teaching on the sacredness of the body. Saint Paul writes, "Do vou not know that vour bodies are members of Christ?....Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit?" (1 Corinthians 6:15, 19). What we do with and to our bodies is important. God loves us as bodily creatures—he made us that way!

Christ's body was raised with him, and so will ours (1 Corinthians 15). We honor God when we revere our bodies as destined for glory. So as long as we treat them with "respect and charity," the Church permits us to use our bodies to help others after death:

"The burial of the dead is a corporal work of mercy....Autopsies can be morally permitted for legal inquests or scientific research. The free gift of organs after death is legitimate and can be meritorious. The Church permits cremation, provided that it does not demonstrate a denial of faith in the resurrection of the body" (CCC 2300 –01)
