Acts 5:27-32, 40B-41

The older I get, the fewer filters I have. Sadly, it's not making me many new friends. Happily, I have enough friends already.

Oops, there went another filter.

Scott Berkun writes in his blog that he has a disease called "Cannot Keep My Mouth Shut." He claims he is in recovery now and shares what he learned: "As a rule, if you insist on speaking your mind, you will inevitably find yourself in an environment where everyone hates you. Most people can not handle the truth (or what you believe is the truth). And the more you shove it in their face, the easier it is for them to ignore you."

Berkun worked at Microsoft but wasn't impressed with his fellow employees. "No one spoke their mind in public. Few people worked hard or asked tough questions. Quality of work and morale was low. I felt obligated to mention these facts as often and as loudly as possible to leadership. I even expected to be rewarded for telling people how bad things were. Why wouldn't they want to hear this?"

They didn't want to hear it. Berkun became "the guy who always complains," and didn't have the power to change anything about the work culture. Having a great idea is wonderful, but it won't go anywhere if you don't have the power to put that idea into action.

The apostles find themselves in a sticky situation in today's Gospel. Having been beaten and imprisoned, they now stand before the Sanhedrin, the ancient Jewish court system that was the supreme religious authority. The high priest wants to know why they are still teaching about Jesus when they were given strict orders to stop.

This constant preaching was causing a lot of turmoil for the temple elite. Extremely tired of being criticized and chastised by Jesus, they figured they took care of the problem when they insisted that he be crucified. His followers nearly trampled over one another in order to disassociate themselves from the fray. Now, here they are, saying the dead man has risen from the grave and are blaming the temple authorities for his death.

Because they encountered the risen Lord, these apostles couldn't contain themselves. They were inciting crowds, healing the sick, ignoring the gag order. Like Berkun, they have the "Cannot Keep My Mouth Shut" disease.

Unlike Berkun, however, they have power behind their ideas and their words. That power? The Holy Spirit. Jesus breathed on them in the upper room, and they received the undeniable and unlimited power of the Holy Spirit. Peter makes it known to the court that they must obey God rather than men. They will not stop preaching.

Immediately after that, they are flogged, given another warning to shut up, and dismissed. And they love it. The Gospel says they left, "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name."

These men, once terrified that they would meet the same death as Jesus, couldn't care less about their lives. They have a mission, and they will die to make it happen.

You know what? We have that same power. How passionate are we?

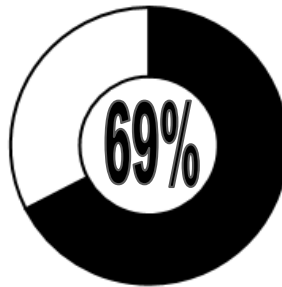

There will be a question and answer session with light refreshments in the cafeteria after Mass for those with questions about the Latin Mass, Priesthood, or Catholicism in general.

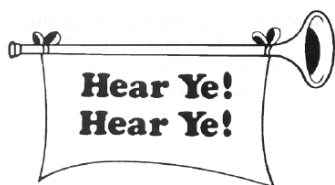

SAINT OF THE WEEK
St. Martin I
Feast day: April 13
 (d. 655)

Martin I lay too sick to fight on a couch in front of the altar when the soldiers burst into the Lateran basilica. He had come to the church when he heard the soldiers had landed. But the thought of kidnapping a sick pope from the house of God didn't stop the soldiers from grabbing him and hustling him down to their ship.

Elected pope in 649, Martin I had gotten in trouble for refusing to condone silence in the face of wrong. At that time there existed a popular heresy that held that Christ didn't have a human will, only a divine will. The emperor had issued an edict that didn't support Monothelism (as it was known) directly, but simply commanded that no one could discuss Jesus' will at all.

Monothelism was condemned at a council convened by Martin I. The council affirmed, once again, that since Jesus had two natures, human and divine, he had two wills, human and divine. The council then went further and condemned Constantine's edict to avoid discussion stating, "The Lord commanded us to shun evil and do good, but not to reject the good with the evil."

In his anger at this slap in the face, the emperor sent his soldiers to Rome to bring the pope to him. When Martin I arrived in Constantinople after a long voyage he was immediately put into prison. There he spent three months in a filthy, freezing cell while he suffered from dysentery. He was not allowed to wash and given the most disgusting food. After he was condemned for treason without being allowed to speak in his defense he was imprisoned for another three months.

From there he was exiled to the Crimea where he suffered from the famine of the land as well as the roughness of the land and its people. But hardest to take was the fact that the pope found himself friendless. His letters tell how his own church had deserted him and his friends had forgotten him. They wouldn't even send him oil or corn to live off of.

He died two years later in exile in the year 656, a martyr who stood up for the right of the Church to establish doctrine even in the face of imperial power.

Dear Padre

If I'm not Catholic, is Mass a must for the kids and me?

My husband is Catholic, but I am not. I know he is supposed to attend Mass every Sunday. What about our children and me—Do we have to go, too?

If your children were baptized in the Catholic Church, then yes, they have to attend Mass. If you or they are not baptized, attendance is not required. One of the basic precepts of our Catholic faith is the obligation of the faithful to attend Mass on Sundays. (**"You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation."**) This assures our regular participation in the eucharistic celebration and commemoration of the Lord's Resurrection (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2042).

I know some other churches don't have the same understanding of obligation as Catholics do, but all Christian churches gather on Sundays. God's third commandment is, **"Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day"** (Exodus 20:8). It can be argued that there are many ways to keep the Sabbath holy, but Christ, the Church, and I believe that the best way is to participate in and partake of the Eucharist—to remember his saving acts, especially the act of dying and rising, and receive his Presence within us. I encourage you to attend your own church or to go to Mass with your spouse and family. Not only will you keep the Lord's day holy, but God will make you holy as well.
