Up Front with Mary Hendricks

Acts 2:1-11

Me and those TED talks. I know you're thinking, "Enough." But this one was really good, okay? It was by a conversation analyst. Yes, there are people who record conversations, line by line, noting the pauses, the intonation, the length of syllables, the intake and release of breath. They study the verbal and non-verbal conduct of social conversations but have found it helpful for interactions in doctors' offices, courts, law enforcement, helplines, educational settings, and media.

Here's an example: most conversations involve "turns." You talk, and then I talk. The time between turns is measured in conversational analysis. Longer turns mean you have control of the floor, which is often a sign of power. If you can control the conversation better, you end up telling your stories, rather than listening to others. Sometimes, a person may talk more out of nervousness, while the person with more power lets them ramble on. Other times, one participant may enjoy listening, regardless of the differences in power. So, a conversational analyst would take the entire conversation and the talkers into account to determine the context.

You're reading this because I find all conversations fascinating. Son # 1 and I chatted for four hours after Mother's Day dinner. My friend Cindy stops by for a couple of hours every few days, and we resolve all the problems of the world. People stop by the office every day to talk. You cannot beat good conversation, in my opinion.

So, what if no one is speaking the same language?

We see that happen with the Old Testament story of the Tower of Babel. The citizens of Shinar, all descendants of Noah, decided to build a city and a tower that reached to heaven, hoping to "make a name" for themselves. They all spoke the same language. God said, "They have started to do this, nothing they presume to do will be out of their reach." So, he confused their language, and no one could understand the speech of another.

Today, in this reading from Acts, we see the exact opposite happen. There were millions of Jews in Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost. Egypt. Asia, Judea, Mesopotamia, Libya. Each one spoke the language of his country. Communication across countries is never easy.

Enter the apostles. For the past 50 days, they've been hiding out in the room where the Last Supper was celebrated, fearing for their lives. The Holy Spirit appears as tongues of fire, and they "began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim."

When they walk outside, each one hears them speaking in their own language. That's pretty amazing. It is, in fact, miraculous. And what's the first thing they hear? About "the mighty works of God."

The Holy Spirit gave the apostles his gifts of courage and knowledge in that upper room. And crowd received the gift of understanding.

Jesus prayed in John 17:20 "that they may all be one." Just for that day, they are "one." Ask the Holy Spirit for the gift of understanding for us, that we may be one.

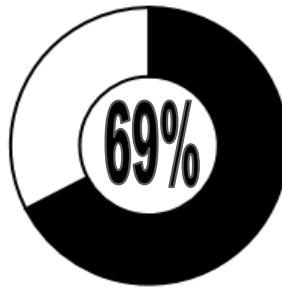

SAINT OF THE WEEK

May 16
St. Peregrine Laziosi
(1260-1345)

Patron of Cancer patients and AIDS patients

Born in Forlì, Italy, Peregrine is the patron saint of persons suffering from cancer, AIDS and other serious diseases.

As a young man he was a member of an anti-papal party until he encountered St. Philip Benizi, the head of the Servite order, who had been sent to try to reconcile the divided community. While trying to preach in Forlì, Philip was heckled and even struck by Peregrine, who was overcome by momentary political fervor. But that moment also changed Peregrine. He began to channel his energies in new directions, engaged in good works and eventually joined the Servites in Siena and went on to be ordained a priest. Returning to his home town, he founded a new Servite house there and became well known for his preaching and holiness as well as his devotion to the sick and poor.

One of the special penances he imposed on himself was standing whenever it was not necessary to sit. Over time, Peregrine developed varicose veins and, in turn, cancer of the foot. The wound became painful and diseased and all medical treatment failed. The local surgeon determined amputation of the leg was called for.

Tradition has it that the night before surgery was scheduled, Peregrine spent much time in prayer before the crucified Jesus, asking God to heal him if it was God's will to do so. Falling asleep at one point, Peregrine had a vision of the crucified Jesus leaving the cross and touching his cancerous leg. When Peregrine awoke, the wound was healed and his foot and leg, seemingly miraculously cured, were saved. He lived another 20 years.

Peregrine was canonized in 1726.

The Bible on life on other planets

What does the Bible say about life outside our solar system?

The simple answer to this question is that the Bible doesn't specifically mention life on other planets. However, there are some

important biblical principles that would speak to the possibility of such a discovery.

Begin with the account of creation in Genesis: "In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth..." (1:1). We believe that everything that exists was created by God. All stars, planets, minerals, plants, and animals flow from the creative activity of the Holy Trinity. If there is any type of life anywhere in the universe, it owes its existence to the God we worship. So if we discover plants, animals, or even ameba on some distant planet, we should praise our Creator for that life as we do our own.

Implicit in this question is the possibility of intelligent life, and not simply lower organisms. Are there possibly societies, technologies, or even churches on other planets? Again, the Bible does not really say. If we find intelligent life, it will not be any threat to our faith. Remember: we understand that we are created in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:26-27). If there are intelligent species out there, they in no way would challenge that unique relationship. After all, the Son of God came to the earth as one of us.
