UpFront with Mary Hendricks

Once, while standing in line at Kroger, I started chatting with the guy in line behind me. By the time I was finished checking out, I knew his name, his hometown, his workplace, where he vacationed, how many kids he had, what they were having for dinner, what kind of vehicle he was driving, and an interesting anecdote about his trip to Weston. All in the time it took to pay for a few groceries.

Back in the car, I told Harry all about my new friend. He said, "You better be careful about that." In my naiveté, I didn't understand what he meant. I'm a trained journalist; I interview people. I'm curious and ask people questions until they quit answering. Why do I need to be cautious? "People could take it the wrong way," Harry explained. He was right, as always. My friendliness has gotten me into sticky situations, but I need to know who people are.

Today, Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do the crowds say I am?" The answers include John the Baptist, Elijah, or a resurrected ancient prophet. Then Jesus asks a more dangerous question: "Who do you say that I am?" He wants to know if their time together has made any impact.

Peter doesn't hesitate: "The Christ of God."

Peter wasn't a rabbi. He wasn't an educated man. He was a fisherman. That's quite a statement from a random guy who answered the call, "Follow me."

What happens next? "He rebuked them" and told them to keep his identity a secret. That must have been a shock, but not as great a shock as the next revelation. He goes into how he will die: be rejected by the Jewish authorities, suffer greatly, will be killed, and, finally, be raised from the dead. Then the biggest shock of all: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

Crazy talk. You're the anointed one of God. You don't want anyone to know. You're going to be tortured and killed. You're going to come back to life. And you want us to take up a cross? What the heck is going on here?

The prospect of "taking up" a cross could not have been appealing. Death by crucifixion was painful, humiliating, and slow.

We read the book, saw the end of the movie, so we know how this story plays out. The Apostles did not have a clue. And here's the strangest thing of all: they didn't run. They didn't say, "He's nuts," and go back to their fishing boats. They stayed right with him until the end—well, not very close, but they were there.

Most people don't follow leaders blindly. We know all too well the stories of those who hitch their wagons to a rising star for their own personal gain. They want the power or the money or the fame.

None of that was in store for the Apostles. Certainly not the power or the money, and they became more infamous than famous in their time. Why did they stay?

They stayed for the same reason you and I are sitting in the pew today. There is just something about Jesus that draws people to him. The pure, unconditional love. The genuine compassion. The comfort he provides. The healing he freely gives. The mercy. The incomprehensible mercy.

You can't find that anywhere else, folks. That's why they, you, and I stay.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Paulinus of Nola

Feast day: June 22

Birth: 354

Death: 431

Bishop of Nola and writer. Pontius Meropius Anicius Paulinus was born to a wealthy Roman family at Bordeaux, in Gaul. His father was the praetorian prefect of Gaul who made certain that his son received a sound education. Paulinus studied rhetoric and poetry and learned from the famed poet Ausonius. He subsequently became a well known lawyer. He became the prefect of Rome, married a Spanish noble lady, Therasia, and led a luxury filled life. Following the death of

his son a week after his birth in 390, Paulinus retreated from the world and came to be baptized a Christian by St. Delphinus in Aquitaine. With Therasia, he gave away their property and vast fortune to the poor and to the Church, and they pursued a life of deep austerity and mortifications. About 393, he was forcibly ordained a priest by the bishop of Barcelona. Soon after, he moved to an estate near the tomb of St. Nola near Naples, Italy. There, he and his wife practiced rigorous asceticism and helped to establish a community of monks. To the consternation of his other relatives, he sold all of their estates in Gaul and gave the money to the poor. He also helped to build a church at Fondi, a basilica near the tomb of St. Felix, a hospital for travelers, and an aqueduct. Many of the poor and sick he brought into his own house, and he lived as a hermit with several of his friends. In 409, he was elected bishop of Nola, serving in this office with great distinction until his death. He was a friend and correspondent of virtually all of the leading figures of his era, including Sts. Augustine, Jerome, Ambrose, Martin of Tours, and Pope Anastasius I. Paulinus was also a gifted poet, earning the distinction of being one of the foremost Christian Latin poets of the Patristic period, an honor he shares with Prudentius. Paulinus retained much of the style of the old classical poets, and composed most of the poems in honor of the feast of St. Felix. He is the author of a body of extant works including fifty one letters, thirty two poems, and several prose pieces.

with the love expressed between spouses in the sexual act, is one of the principal ends of marriage. The act itself is holy within that context, and the resulting children are a fruit of that love and a gift—not a right of every couple. Most of us know couples who are unable to conceive. Sometimes a technique or medication can help, but not always.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states that, “techniques that entail the dissociation of husband and wife, by the intrusion of a person other than the couple (donation of sperm or ovum, surrogate uterus), are gravely immoral.... Techniques involving only the married couple (homologous artificial insemination and fertilization) are perhaps less reprehensible, yet remain morally unacceptable.... Only respect for the link between the meanings of the conjugal act and respect for the unity of the human being make possible procreation in conformity with the dignity of the person” (CCC 2376–77, see also *Donum vitae*).

Infertility treatments such as *in vitro* fertilization (IVF) not only depersonalize the sexual act but also carry the greater problem of the disposal of the fertilized but unused embryos, which are real human beings. When judging an act, we must consider our intentions and the act's nature and ramifications. Most situations involve many issues, so I suggest you discuss yours further with a competent spiritual advisor.
