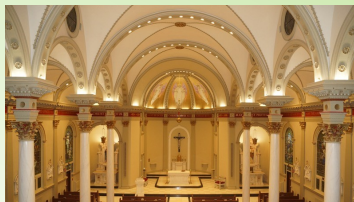

UpFront

with Mary Hendricks

Luke 10:1-10, 17-20

Let's talk about resumes. Most start out with an objective: "To obtain a job within my field that will challenge me and use my education, skills, and experiences to benefit me and my employer." Then you list your diplomas and certifications, your work history, the stellar achievements in your life, associations or interests, and references. You make yourself sound as qualified as possible for the job.

And then someone from the church office asks you to be a reader or catechist, rosary leader, RCIA sponsor, or cantor, and, all of a sudden, those qualifications disappear. People freeze and feel totally unequipped to serve in church ministry.

Jesus didn't ask for resumes when he sent out the 72 disciples to proclaim the kingdom in today's Gospel. In fact, he un-equips them. He takes everything away: no money, no sack, no sandals, and don't talk to anyone along the way. He is keeping them safe with this advice—there was no shortage of robbers on those roads—and making them rely on God for all their needs. He is keeping them focused on the mission of telling people, "The kingdom of God is at hand."

"Offer peace, stay in one place, eat and drink what is offered, cure the sick, and move on" make up the next set of directions. Finally, if they are unwelcome, they shake the dust off their feet and skedaddle. Jews would be familiar with shaking the dust off their feet—they did it every time they passed from Gentile territory back into the Holy Land. It showed separation from the unclean pagans. To shake dust off after leaving a *Jewish* town? Uh oh. Huge indictment.

By un-equipping these disciples, Jesus makes them vulnerable and humble. He even calls them "lambs among wolves." By making them stay in one home, he allows them to build a relationship with their hosts. By telling them to "eat and drink whatever is offered," he's saying to forget about the mandatory dietary restrictions. By telling them to cure the sick, he is laying the foundation for healing their spiritual ills.

Here are three more things I really want you to notice in this reading: 1) No names are mentioned. They are anonymous, no celebrities among them. 2) Jesus sent them out in pairs. Only twice in the Gospels did any of his followers go out alone—Judas when he betrayed the Lord and Peter when he denied the Lord. Two heads are always better than one. 3) Jesus sent them to "every town and place he intended to visit." He was turning these fishermen into farmers, sowing the seeds of his Word so that he can harvest at a later date.

When the disciples return, they are rejoicing at their success. Jesus quickly brings them back to earth: "Don't rejoice because of your achievements. Rejoice because your names are written in heaven." They find out then that they are part of the harvest Jesus will gather.

Last week, Jesus told us about the commitment to discipleship. He wants us to be "all in." This week, he's telling us to be humble and vulnerable, to rely on him for everything we need, not worrying about our qualifications or the results.

Remember that if someone from the church office asks you to volunteer in the next couple of months. ;)

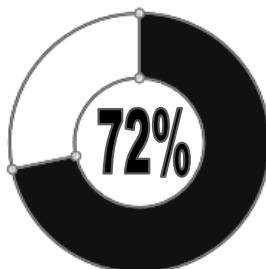

Parent is concerned about kids who have fallen away

I raised my children in the faith, but two of them left the Church to embrace another denomination, and two others, although still Catholic, have not committed to regular church attendance. I worry about their salvation.

Your experience is not unknown to many Catholic parents. I'm sure my own mother could carry on a good conversation with you about her concern for the faith life of her children.

The journey of faith has many paths. An individual may think more deeply about the meaning of life or find religion after a momentous experience or in the process of gathering and sharing with a community in which they find support, clarity, or rituals that express their beliefs, or guidelines for living morally.

For those of us who grew up believing, chances are we were not introduced to religion through logic. Children are brought to church long before they are aware of their need for God. They learn doctrine and attend worship before questions of faith and religion form within them. Passing on the faith is a great gift that parents give, and it will serve these young people well. Your children have tools to help them find their way, and God continues to be with them. Follow the example of St. Monica, and pray for them. Trust this one to God, and continue to give good example.

**Background:**

The storm last week and subsequent flooding have caused significant damage, injury, and the tragic loss of life across West Virginia. Catholic Charities West Virginia joins all people of faith in prayer for those who have lost loved ones, lost homes, and those that have been affected by the devastation.

Since the on-set Catholic Charities WV's Statewide Disaster Coordinator has participated in WV-VOAD (Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters) calls. The group of organizations includes first responders, emergency management personnel and disaster recovery organizations like Catholic Charities WV.

First responders are actively working to save lives, evacuate people from dangerous situations and provide temporary shelter, food and other basic needs. Those organizations that are engaged in these immediate response roles are publishing their own needs for volunteers and support.

Catholic Charities West Virginia's Disaster Services plays a significant role in the long term (sometimes several years) recovery after a widespread disaster occurrence. **Thank you for your kindness!**

The funds collected at that time will go directly to CCWVa's long term disaster recovery fund.

FLOOD UPDATE FROM THE LEWIS COUNTY COMMISSION

Thank you to all who worked loading supplies for flood victims. People have responded with overwhelming generosity. Even people from other states stopped and donated supplies.

At the present time, counties are trying to inventory the supplies they have received and assess what they will need in the future. They are now receiving supplies from the federal government so the need for supplies is not as desperate as it had been.

However, they need "boots on the ground" to assist in the clean-up. Before going to flood-damaged areas, contact the VOAD (Volunteer Organizations Assisting Disasters) at 304-558-5380.
