## UpFront

with Mary Hendricks

Luke 12:32-48

Jesus closes today's reading with: "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."

Every month, the Lewis County Christian Alliance meets at a different church in the area. As secretary-treasurer, I represent the Catholic contingent and spend a couple of hours with pastors and associates from the Baptist, Methodist, Church of God, Episcopalian, and evangelical communities.

It's as much a support group as a "do-gooder" organization where we believe that what we share in Jesus Christ is greater than our differences. We encourage one another, knowing that we can achieve more together than separately.

An interesting discussion came up last month when one pastor said he was concerned about salvation for people who were not baptized. He quoted Jesus in John 14:6: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." "What about the religions that don't recognize Jesus? The people who have never heard about Jesus? What about the people who are not baptized? All of those people are condemned to hell." Many in the group nodded in agreement.

Another pastor said his church believed that God, in his infinite mercy, would judge differently when the unbaptized stood before him. There wasn't an argument; it was a "Let's agree to disagree" moment. But I don't think anyone changed his mind. I piped in: "What did you think about the Pope's statement that even atheists may go to heaven?" Dead silence. Ooooookay! Let's have lunch!

About a week later, a friend who had been at the meeting asked what I thought of the conversation. "Well," I began, "We know that God is a merciful God. His mercy is way beyond our understanding because we judge subjectively. I believe he will judge each person individually, knowing things we can never know. Now, here's what the Catholic Church teaches: Jesus died for all of us and wants everyone to be saved. There are people who don't know about Jesus through no fault of their own. Some people have been poisoned by their culture or their families against Christianity, so they have a messed up view, and that's not their fault, either. If they sincerely seek God, try to do his will, and live a good life, God will judge them mercifully. It's not for us to decide who goes to heaven and who doesn't."

Then I threw in the kicker. "And besides, if there are people who don't know about Jesus, it's *our* fault. *We're* the ones he told to 'go, teach all nations,' and if we're not doing that, who's going to get judged more harshly? We will."

We have been given much, so more is demanded of us. When we stand in judgment before God, he will ask if we followed through with that "Go, teach all nations" thing. Will we be able to answer that we did our best? Better be.

If we didn't, maybe it's because we didn't know how to carry out that important directive. Oh, you're going to be so happy to know that the GIFT program will concentrate on discipleship this year. You *are* happy about that, right? I knew it!

Each month we will examine how to be a better disciple and get practical suggestions on being witnesses of the love of Jesus to others. Are you willing to join us for one of the sessions?

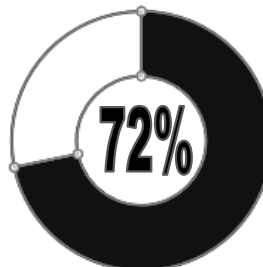

The Church on evolution  
Christians teach that Adam and Eve were the first man and woman and were created by God. How does the Catholic Church reconcile this belief with the theory of evolution?

Genesis Chapter 1 contains the seven-day account of creation that we usually refer to when we reflect on the beginning of our world. The very next chapter contains a second account.

The editors of the Bible were not distraught over the two differing accounts; they left them side by side because they weren't interested in giving either a historical or scientific explanation for the world's origin. Rather, they were emphasizing deeper truths such as the goodness of the earth as created by a loving and caring God. Scripture tells us that the Creator held human beings as especially precious.

Cannot these same values be maintained if we believe creation (or evolution) took longer than seven days? Perhaps God spent seventy billion years bringing forth the world's beauty. Details and numbers don't change the message of Genesis: God is good; God created the cosmos, heaven and earth—"all things visible and invisible"; and all of creation is good (Nicene Creed). Furthermore, scientific discoveries surrounding space, matter, and all forms of life "invite us to even greater admiration for the greatness of the Creator, prompting us to give him thanks for all his works and for the understanding and wisdom he gives to scholars and researchers" (CCC 283).

## PARENT INFORMATION REGARDING TUITION ASSISTANCE

### 2016-2017 DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE PROCESS IS OPEN

For the 25th consecutive year, the Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program (**TAP**) is striving to keep Catholic school education affordable for Catholic families who desire it for their children but may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. Thanks to the ongoing and genuine commitment of Bishop Michael J. Bransfield to the Catholic schools in our Diocese, funds have, once again, been allocated for distribution to Catholic families in need of financial assistance.

Applying for **TAP through FACTS** is easy and affordable. You are encouraged to apply if your child is already enrolled or has been accepted by one of the Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston for the 2016-2017 school year.

**Who is eligible?** Any Catholic student accepted for the 2016-2017 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school (PK thru grade 12) **and who belong to a parish included on the drop-down list on the application** is eligible. Determinations are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants.

**How do I apply?** You may apply on-line. Go to [www.factsmgt.com](http://www.factsmgt.com) and log in.

**Cost?** The application fee is \$25. The Diocese will pay \$12.50 and families pay the other \$12.50.

**Grants:** Diocesan grants for families who have completed their applications and show financial need will receive **up to 50%** of the child's tuition.

#### Phase I: **Deadline is April 30, 2016**

In order to receive notification in late May, applications (**including all required documentation and payment of the fee**) are to be received by FACTS by April 30, 2016. Phase I is intended for families with children currently enrolled or already accepted for the 2016-2017 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school.

#### Phase II: **Deadline is August 15, 2016**

In order to receive notification in late August, all applications for 2016-2017 (**including all required documentation and payment of the fee**) **MUST** be **RECEIVED** by FACTS no later than August 15, 2016. **This is a firm deadline.** Phase II is intended for families new to the school or who have had a life-changing event (birth, death, loss of job) occur. If an application was submitted during Phase I, please contact the school.

**Note 1: No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless:**

- an application is completed in full (ALL questions answered) and submitted
- all required documentation is provided, AND
- the family portion (\$12.50) of the application fee is paid **by the deadline.**

**Note 2: ONLY ONE APPLICATION PER FAMILY** should be submitted per school year. If you made an error or had a life event change, please do **NOT** submit a second application. Contact your principal and your application can be updated by FACTS.
