UpFront with Mary Hendricks Luke 13:22-30

As the boys grew older, they wanted to go to church on Saturday night instead of on Sunday morning with us. So, I asked them to bring me a bulletin to be sure they actually went to Mass. It was their "ticket stub." Of course, I knew it was possible that they stuck their head in the front door, grabbed the bulletin, and took off to more interesting teenage pursuits, but I chose to believe that they actually stayed for the entire liturgy. Oh, and I gave them a pop quiz about the homily, too, just in case.

The disciples in today's Gospel knew they had a first-class ticket to heaven. In fact, they were the "few" when they asked Jesus if "only a few people will be saved." The Jews were positive that they were the only ones going to heaven. Jesus, the King of Flip, says he won't even know who they are. Every time the disciples think they know what he's going to say or have him cornered, he flips it over on them and throws them off.

Just because you have a baptism certificate and a regular pew, it doesn't mean that you're on the fast track to sainthood. Yeah, sure, I work for the church and go to Mass fairly often, but I also cuss like a sailor, can gossip with the best of them, and have a myriad of other sins you don't want to hear about (well, you may want to hear about them, but I'm not telling!). John White once told me he wanted to hang onto my feet when I was sailing up to heaven. I'm not so sure that's where I'm headed, John. On the dark days, I have more faith in gravity than in a merciful final judgment.

If you're reading this because you picked it up in church, thank you for coming to Mass in the first place, but Mass isn't religion. You may be all about being a lector or a Eucharistic minister, or you may be kicking yourself because you aren't one, but those activities won't bump you up on the passenger list of the Heaven Express. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says "Religion is the context for faith. While being active members of a church may not bring us closer to God, membership certainly helps. It pricks our hard hearts and jabs our dull minds toward God and what he offers us. Religion sharpens the focus so we can accept God's gifts and grow in his presence." Religious activities are good only because they help focus our eyes on God.

The disciples told Jesus, "But we ate with you, and you taught in our streets. We were right there in your presence." But Jesus said he still didn't know them. The only way he could know them was if he had a relationship with them. How about you? Will he know you? Think relationship, not religion. That's your ticket.

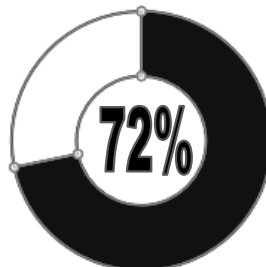

Why did Jesus make his points with parables?

Why did Jesus always speak in parables? Why didn't he give us more clear-cut answers?

Parables are short, relatable stories. Their simple images or comparisons convey a moral or religious lesson and put us in touch with the mystery of God and ourselves. Thus, parables confront the hearer or reader with a radical choice to enter God's kingdom: "One must enter the kingdom, that is, become a disciple of Christ, in order to 'know the secrets of the kingdom of heaven.' For those who stay 'outside,' everything remains enigmatic" (CCC 546).

About a third of Jesus' recorded teachings are in parable form. After the Pharisees rejected Jesus (Matthew 12:14), he immediately changed his straightforward preaching to parables. This fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet: "I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation [of the world]" (Matthew 13:35; see Psalm 78:2).

For example, the three parables of mercy in Luke 15—the lost sheep, lost coin, and lost son—reveal as much about God as they do about us. As John Shea writes in *Stories of God*: "God not only loves to hear our stories, God loves to tell stories. And, quite simply, we are the story God tells." In the telling, we ourselves are told. The timeless, universal stories of Jesus speak to us at different stages of life and provide multiple levels of meaning to the openhearted.

Novena To Saint Monica (Began on August 18)

Exemplary Mother of the Great Augustine, you perseveringly pursued your wayward son not with wild threats but with prayerful cries to heaven.

Intercede for all parents in our day so that they may learn to draw their children to God.

Teach them how to remain close to their children, even the prodigal sons and daughters who have sadly gone astray.

Dear St Monica, troubled wife and mother, many sorrows pierced your heart during your lifetime. Yet you never despaired or lost faith.

With confidence, persistence and profound faith, you prayed daily for the conversion of your beloved husband, Patricius and your beloved son, Augustine. Grant us that same fortitude, patience and trust in the Lord.

Intercede for us, dear St. Monica, that God may favorably hear our plea *for the perseverance of all parents of children who have fallen away from the Faith, and for those children themselves, that God may open their hearts to His call.*

And grant us the grace to accept his will in all things, through Jesus Christ, our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, One God forever and ever. Amen.

What is a Novena? A novena is a nine-day period of prayer for a specific intention or as part of a particular devotion (The Holy Infant of Prague, the Miraculous Medal, etc.). The novena comes from the tradition of the nine days between the Ascension of Our Lord and the Solemn Feast of Pentecost, during which time the Apostles remained in the Upper Room in prayer. A novena is a powerful prayer that the Church has preserved in her tradition ever since.
