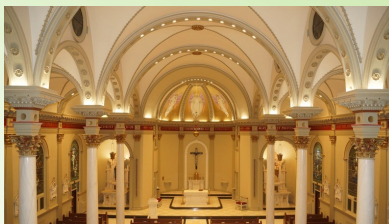

## UpFront

with Mary Hendricks

Luke 14:1, 7-14

For my birthday trip this year, I took Sons #1 & #2 to Providence, RI, to see the mansions at Newport. These "cottages" were built by extremely wealthy businessmen to escape the New York summertime heat with their families. It was before income tax was instituted, and money flowed freely.

The largest of these homes is The Breakers, owned by Cornelius Vanderbilt, who made his money in the shipping and railroad industries. Built in two years (1893-1895), The Breakers would cost \$150-million in today's dollars to build. It is, and I don't say this lightly, a jaw-dropping palace that looks out on the Narraganset Bay.

Nearly every wall is embossed with 18-carat gold leaf. The Baccarat crystal chandeliers are wired for either electric or gas. Bathtubs and sinks are plumbed for either fresh water or saltwater, depending on your preference. Mrs. Vanderbilt's bedroom has four closets for her possible seven clothing changes per day: breakfast, a car ride down Bellevue Avenue, lunch, strolling along the Cliff Walk, afternoon tea, dinner, evening parties. The kitchen is a French chef's dream. Set apart from the house because Mr. Vanderbilt was terrified of fire (his first Breakers house was destroyed by fire), the kitchen features a flameless cooktop. The house has 70 rooms over nearly 126,000 square feet. It was occupied for only six weeks per year.

What we didn't see were the servants' quarters. The 40 employees of The Breakers were virtually invisible, moving about the house through back hallways. They lived on the third and fourth floors in cramped, sweltering rooms, sleeping on mattresses as small as 18 inches wide with springs poking through. Most were immigrants who worked from 6am until at least 9pm six days a week.

The Breakers is the epitome of the Gilded Age, of opulence and luxury. Its purpose was to flaunt wealth, to invite envy, and to imitate the crown princes of Europe. I don't know if the servants were mistreated, but I do know they weren't trusted. The silverware was locked in a safe every night and only the housemaid had a key to the linen closet. Alistair Cooke said of Newport: "One hundred years after the declaration that all men are created equal, there began to gather in Newport a colony of the rich, determined to show that some Americans were conspicuously more equal than others."

Humility was nowhere to be seen among the elite of Newport. Nowhere.

Today, Jesus asks us to be humble. Don't sit in the best seat. Invite people who can't repay you to dinner. Be kind to the poor, the lame, and the blind.

The palatial home of Newport are empty today. Over 400,000 people visit The Breakers each year, but the home isn't owned by the Vanderbilts anymore. In fact, Donald Trump just bought it for \$112-million. Some of the homes were stripped and auctioned by bankrupt families. The homes are lifeless museums of a bygone era.

I wonder how different Newport would have been if Jesus' words were taken to heart by the inhabitants. If servants were treated as well as the visitors. If the 15--pound trays of food, displayed by servers at the dinner parties, were shared with the kitchen help. If a tenth of the money to build each extravagant home was shared with the poor.

And then I wonder what our lives would be like if we gave without expecting return, forgave without demanding anything, offered joy to someone in need, gave our time without resentment. What a wonderful way to live.

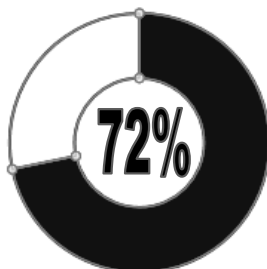

## Can anyone write a prayer?

My friend says she's writing a prayer for us to say at the start of our monthly book-club meetings. She has no formal religious training, so will this prayer "count"?

It's given to every human being to be able to pray. On the level of the spiritual life, prayer is as basic as breathing is to physical life. Everyone at every moment has the grace to say a prayer. Sometimes I ask people, "Do you pray?" At times they tell me they don't. Then I ask them, "Well, do you talk with God?" Of course, they do, at least sometimes. That's praying. As far as your friend's prayer for the monthly book club meeting, I suggest this ancient definition of prayer as a measure of how well she does her job: Prayer is the raising of the mind and heart to God. I'm sure it will be that in word and feeling, and it will "count."

For more formal occasions, it's nice to include the prayer elements the Church considers important: adoration of God, contrition and sorrow for sin, thanksgiving for life and for God's care of us in good times and bad, and petition for what we desperately need in our poverty.

And for you, a final word.

Remember that, no matter how bad things may get, no matter how out of control, you always have the gift and power of saying a prayer. Especially in time of temptation—when things really go bad—ask Mary your Mother to pray with you.
