UpFront

with Mary Hendricks

2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14

Did you watch any scary Halloween movies last week? Sorry, not my cup of tea. The closest I get to scary movies is my current favorite, "Arsenic and Old Lace."

But, if you like to be scared out of your wits, read the entire seventh chapter of 2 Maccabees. We get a slice (pardon the pun) of it in today's first reading. Seven brothers and their mother are arrested by King Antiochus who wants to force them to eat pork in violation of the Jewish law. They refuse, so each one is brutally tortured, and brutally tortured is an understatement. One by one, they are killed in front of their mother, who is martyred last.

The brave boys aren't afraid to suffer and die rather than disobey the law. Each one speaks his mind to the king who gets more and more furious. We hear the young men say, "You accursed fiend, you are depriving us of this present life, but the king of the universe will raise us up to live again forever, because we are dying for his laws," and "What's the delay? I will not obey the king's command. I obey the command of the law given to our ancestors through Moses.'

All this over pork? Actually, King Antiochus was trying to get his kingdom to live together peacefully. He had Hellenists, a Greek culture, who thought everyone should be Greek. And the Jews, who wanted to hold on to their own culture and the Mosaic law. So, the king decided to force the Jews to follow his law instead of the law of Moses. I'm all about following laws, but if he had waved ribs in front of my face, it would have been a conundrum for me. Bacon, I could live without. But, ribs...

Back to the story. As each goes to his gruesome death, he is encouraged by his mother who speaks to them in the language of their ancestors, Hebrew. This enrages the king because he can't understand what she is saying. Neither can he understand her sons' willingness to die while their mother watches and prays with them.

This woman. Where does she get the courage to witness the deaths of the people most precious to her? To stand up to a king who denigrates her God and his laws? Could you do it? Could you be that faithful?

Oh, wow. I'd have to think long and hard about those questions. Here's about as close as I got to asking my sons to be faithful. I had a serious conversation with Son #1 a few years ago. "Listen," I urgently said, "If you happen to marry a girl who isn't Catholic, please, please don't join her church and leave the Catholic Church. Please."

"Mom," he said, rolling his eyes, "Do you think that after all I've seen with you and Dad, all those years of going to Mass, to Catholic school, that I would ever leave the Catholic Church? You're crazy." He says that to me a lot.

But I keep thinking about the Maccabees mom and how brave she is. Jeff McLeod says that the woman pre-figures the Blessed Mother. "The valiant woman of 2 Maccabees is a foreshadowing of the Blessed Mother who prays for us at the hour of our death. It seems significant to me that this

valiant woman spoke in Hebrew. She knows that the faith of our childhood soothes us and gives us courage to withstand difficulty. In the face of mindboggling change and uncertainty, she wants us to return to the faith of our ancestors. Come back to the Church, she says. Attend Mass, read the Bible. Study your catechism. Go to Confession. Pray the Rosary.'

Dr. McLeod continues, "The valiant mother didn't condemn Hellenism or the Greeks. She went higher because she knew the patent disorder of Hellenism was just a symptom of a larger disorder, a warped and corrupted view of the world and our place in it. She simply told the truth about life and eternity. She urges her sons to have courage so that she may see them once again after death. This valiant woman, this figure of the Blessed Mother, taught divine mercy in the heart of the Old Testament just as she teaches it today."



This GIFT session will be the class for both the Confirmandi and those participating in RCIC.







Are non-Catholics eligible to be named saints?

"The cause of beatification and canonization regards a Catholic who in life, in death and after death has enjoyed a reputation of holiness by living all the Christian virtues in an heroic manner" (Sanctorum Mater, 4.1). In this process, the Catholic Church not only

investigates the heroic virtues of a candidate, but confirms miracles attributed to them after their death, and ultimately declares a person to be a saint in heaven and worthy of veneration.

Moreover, the process is ecclesial: it is executed by the Catholic Church for the holiness of its members. "By canonizing some of the faithful, i.e., by solemnly proclaiming that they practiced heroic virtue lived in fidelity to God's grace, the

recognizes the power of the Spirit of holiness within her and sustains the hope of believers by proposing the saints to them as models and intercessors" (CCC 828).

While there are non-Catholic saints worthy of canonization, the Church does not presume to canonize members of other churches (should they even be presented for validation); rather, the Church favors candidates who are in the same full communion of

faith as the Catholics whose understanding of saints look to them as intercessors. As Kenneth Woodward wrote in Making Saints, "Catholic saints make sense only within a world where the 'body of Christ' is more than just a metaphor."
