Building the Domestic Church in Our Homes

"Only by praying together with their children can a father and mother exercising their royal priesthood penetrate the innermost depths of their children's hearts and leave an impression that the future events in their lives will not be able to efface." John Paul II, Familiaris Consortio

When we read the first two chapters of Genesis in the Bible, we learn how fundamental to God's plan for creation the family is. *In fact, the family is* the plan. In light of the New Testament. there is no other plan! God sent His Son to redeem fallen man, and the redemption gets us back to these beginnings again. Pope John Paul II explains that in the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus insists that modifications anv of the plan for the family be swept away — that we return to "the beginning" with His teaching.

The beginning is this: the first covenant that God

made with Adam and Eve, telling them to be fruitful and multiply. He gave them to each other in marriage, saying, "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife" (Matt. 19:5). He gave all of humanity this "unity of the two" (as John Paul II calls it), the "two become one flesh," a unity that mysteriously unfolds into the gift of new life, a child.

A loving home of our own is a fundamental need embedded in our human nature. It's rooted in the original plan that God has for man, which he lays
