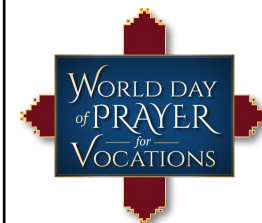


Holy Hour for Vocations

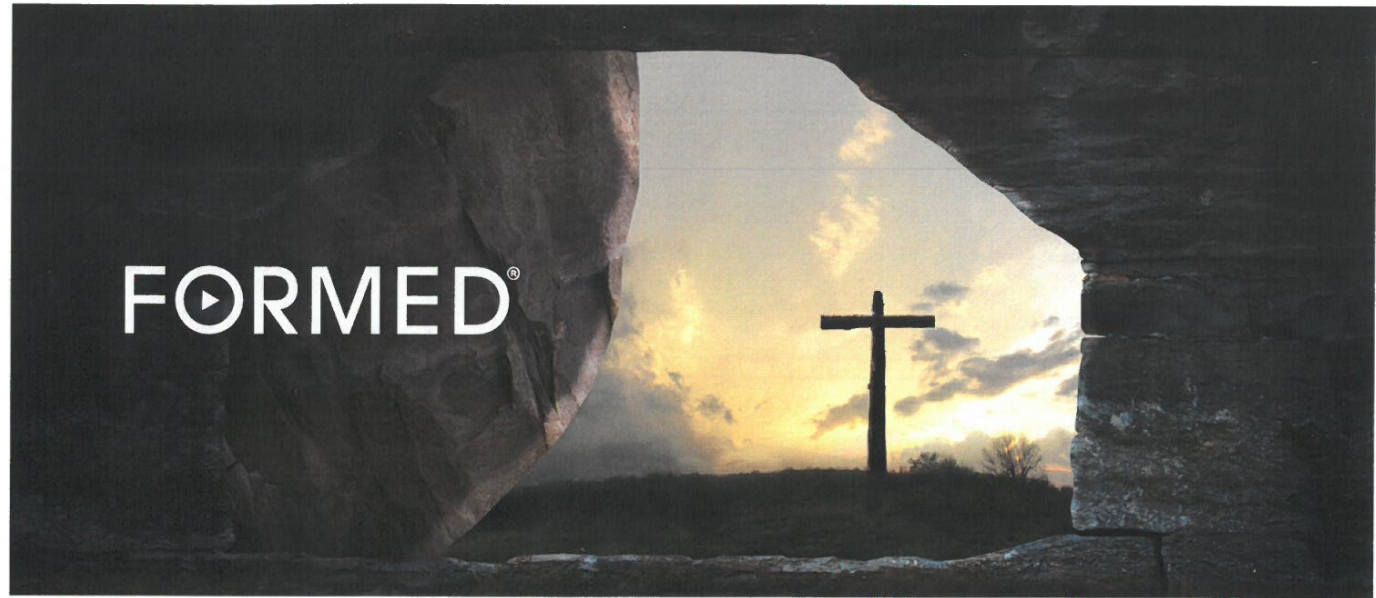
