



Commentary for the Readings in the Extraordinary Form: Fourth Sunday after Easter

"If I do not go, the Advocate will not come;...but if I go, I will send Him to you. . . He will (convince) the world. . . of jus- of "justice" revealed tice" (Gospel).

The Sunday of Justice, interior and social! The Holy Spirit descends upon us with His seven Gifts at our Confirmation (symbolized by the Dove). He puts before us the imitation of Christ's sinless example, since "the prince of this world" had tried to confuse and even destroy the correct ideas of right and wrong. Hence we may now sing "a new canticle," because God 'hath revealed His justice" (Introit).

The Epistle and Offertory extol the gifts of interior "justice;" the Prayer, evidently referring to social "justice," makes us realize that only God can "make (all) of one will."


Backpack Food Program Donations Needed

Items needed are individual meals, mac and cheese and other pastas, soups, snacks, breakfast foods, pudding and gelatin, fruit and granola bars, peanut butter, crackers, cookies etc. Items should be individually wrapped.

May is the Month of Mary

The month of May is dedicated to The Blessed Virgin Mary. The first 20 days fall within the liturgical season of Easter, which is represented by the liturgical color white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored). The remainder of the month (beginning the Monday after Pentecost) in Ordinary Time which is represented by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection.
