
The Ascension

Many of you are aware that back in the winter it was announced that Mrs. Maureen Gildein would be stepping down from her position as Principal of our parish school to pursue other interests. After an exhaustive national and local search, the search committee selected Dr. Ian Scheu, to fill her position.

Dr. Scheu comes to us with a diverse educational background. He completed his academic training in central Virginia, including the University of Virginia (Masters in Educational Psychology) and Virginia Commonwealth University (Doctor of Instructional Leadership). He has taught in a variety of educational environments, including rural, urban, public, and private institutions. He was a professor of Education at California Lutheran University, but was called away from that position to attend to family matters following the death of his father. He relocated his family to Key Largo, Florida, in order to help manage the family business, and has been teaching concurrently for the past two years in the Key Largo public school system.

Dr. Scheu is a devout Catholic, and he is not only excited about having the opportunity to work in Catholic education, but he also looks forward to joining our parish community and raising his family in a more wholesome environment than either Key Largo or southern California could provide. His expertise in instructional leadership and curriculum development place our school at a distinct advantage for the future, as we seek to continue to build a solid academic program in our Catholic tradition.

While many of us are often uncomfortable with the unknown, I firmly believe that this is a unique opportunity for our school's programming to be approached with fresh ideas and a healthy sense of what it truly means to be a Catholic institution. I ask that all our parishioners do their very best to make Dr. Scheu and his family feel welcome as members not only of our school, but of our parish family and Lewis County community.

Of your charity, please pray for Dr. Scheu, for Mrs. Gildein, for our school, our parish, and one another. May St. Patrick continue to intercede for us, and may God bless us abundantly.

Backpack Food Program Donations Needed To cover the next two weeks!

Thank you to everyone who has given generously to the backpack food program throughout the years. This school year alone, over \$1,900 has gone to help the 67 children who receive the food donations. We have teamed up with the Lewis County Family Resource Network to purchase items at a discounted price to help make our funds go further. The FRN will not place another bulk order before the end of the school year and our supplies are getting low.

Food donations can be dropped off at the parish office or placed in the vestibule of the church. Items needed are individual meals, mac and cheese and other pastas, soups, snacks, breakfast foods, pudding and gelatin, fruit and granola bars, peanut butter, crackers, cookies etc. Items should be individually wrapped.

If you would prefer to make a monetary donation, checks can be made payable to St. Patrick Church and marked for the backpack program. They can be placed in the collection basket or dropped off to the parish office.
