

November Highlights

During November, as in all of Ordinary Time (Time After Pentecost), the Liturgy signifies and expresses the regenerated life from the coming of the Holy Spirit, which is to be spent on the model of Christ's Life and under the direction of His Spirit. As we come to the end of the Church year we are asked to consider the end times, our own as well as the world's. The culmination of the liturgical year is the Feast of Christ the King. "This feast asserts the supreme authority of Christ over human beings and their institutions.... Beyond it we see Advent dawning with its perspective of the Lord's coming in glory."— The Liturgy and Time, A.G. Mortimort

This month the main feasts are the Solemnity of All Saints (November 1), All Souls (November 2), St. Martin de Porres (November 3), Lateran Basilica (November 9), St. Leo the Great (November 10), St. Josaphat (November 12), St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (November 13), St. Albert the Great (November 15), Sts. Margaret of Scotland and Gertrude (November 16), St. Elizabeth of Hungary (November 17), Presentation of Mary (November 21), St. Cecilia (November 22), Sts. Clement I and St. Columban (November 23), St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions (November 24), the Solemnity of Christ the King (November 25) and St. Andrew (November 30).

The feasts of St. Charles Borromeo, (November 4), St. Martin of Tours, (November 11) and St. Catherine of Alexandria (November 25) are superseded by the Sunday Liturgy.

Commentary for the Readings in the Extraordinary Form: Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost

"When Jesus came to the ruler's house, and saw the flute players and the crowd making a din, He said, 'Begone, the girl is asleep, not dead.' And they laughed Him to scorn. But when the crowd had been put out, He went in and took her by the hand; and the girl arose" (Gospel).

Notice the small flute-playing figures at the left. They represent the crowd of people who laugh their Creator to scorn.

Yet how often we move among them, enjoying what we call "life," even though we may be spiritually dead.

The trumpet-blowing angel at the right, summoning the dead to life, represents how Jesus, after the crowd has been put out by us, raises His Hand over us in absolution, extends His Hand to us in Holy Communion.

St. Paul, too, warns us against these enemies of the cross of Christ whose end is ruin, whose god is the belly." Excerpted from My Sunday Missal, Confraternity of the Precious Blood

Buy gift cards from over 750 brands at ShopWithScrip.com. Participating retailers give a rebate for every purchase. Retailers set the amount of the rebate. Rebates range from 1% to 25%. The rebate on the gift card immediately goes to funding your organization’s initiatives. You use the gift card on your everyday shopping.

What is ScripNow?

Electronic gift cards are available from many of our retailers, and can be ordered and printed from your ShopWithScrip® account. The Scrip-Now eCard is delivered to your ShopWithScrip account in minutes when you pay for your order with PrestoPay - 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Print the certificate and redeem it in stores, or copy and paste the code at checkout to apply to an online purchase. You can also order and redeem ScripNow right from your phone using MyScripWallet.com.

How do I order ScripNow?

In the Shop tab, sort by Card Type and choose “ScripNow” to view all our available ScripNow products. Or, when searching for a specific retailer (i.e. Home Depot, Amazon.com), move your mouse over their logo to view available product types. The ScripNow logo will appear in full color, if available. Click the logo to order. You can also order ScripNow on your mobile device at MyScripWallet.com. On the “Order” page, choose ScripNow to list all available ScripNow brands.

How do I pay for ScripNow?

For quick delivery, PrestoPay is recommended. When you pay with PrestoPay, you’ll receive your eCard in 30 minutes or less. You can also pay your coordinator by check. This will delay the process since your ScripNow eCard will only be delivered after your coordinator receives your payment and releases your order.


How long do I have to wait after ordering, before I can use my ScripNow?

ScripNow orders paid with PrestoPay are delivered within minutes. You will receive an email confirmation, along with a notification on your dashboard. ScripNow orders paid by personal check are fulfilled minutes after your coordinator releases your order.

What if I don't use the full amount of the ScripNow eCard on my purchase?

It works in the same way that the physical cards do. The remaining balance is still on there to use for a future purchase.

Thirty-First Sunday of Ordinary Time

The first reading is taken from Deuteronomy 6:2-6. Moses, having received the Ten Commandments from God on Mount Sinai, set about teaching them to the Israelites.

The second reading is from the first Letter of St. Paul to the Hebrews 7:23-28 where he continues to show the superiority of Jesus over the high priests of the Old Testament.

The Gospel is from Mark 12:28-34. The personal lesson which comes over loud and clear for every sincere Christian from today's gospel, is that the solid foundation of our Christian religion is love of God and neighbor. As our Lord says: "there is no other commandment greater than these." All the other commandments are expansions of these two and indications of how we are to put these two commandments into daily practice. For example: why am I forbidden to murder my neighbor? Simply because he belongs to God; it was God who gave him his life, and God has commanded me to love and respect him. Taking his life is interfering with God's rights, and disobeying him as well. Likewise, the prohibition of idolatry, refraining from insulting God's name, keeping the Sabbath day holy are the principal ways of indicating how we should love God.

One may ask: how can I love God? He is infinitely perfect, he needs nothing from me,


what therefore can I do for him? I can understand loving my neighbor—for a neighbor can need help, advice, encouragement and consolation. I can prove my love by giving these to my neighbor, but God has no such needs. It is quite true that true love is not theoretical but pragmatic, it means doing some good for somebody. While the infinite God has no needs that I can supply, he has claims on my service, on my respect, on my gratitude—claims so basic and so great that I must be ready to suffer persecution and even death rather than deny or dishonor him (Mt. 5: 10; Lk. 6: 23). It was God who gave me existence and every gift that I have. It was God, through the incarnation of his own divine Son, who made me his adopted child and heir to heaven. Everything that I am and have and hope to be, I owe to God's generosity; therefore, he has an unquestionable right to my gratitude, my reverence, my respect—these are the ways in which I can show my love for him.

The keeping of God's commandments, the prayers of thanksgiving, praise and petition which daily we offer, the attendance at Mass and other liturgical functions, these are the means God gives us of showing our love, our recognition of total dependence on him and our gratitude for all he has done and is doing for us. God does not need any of these signs of our submission and reverence and respect, but we need them absolutely, for they are the means he has given us of fulfilling his purpose in creating us—to share his eternal glory with him. To love God then, is not an obligation imposed on us by some demanding superior but a privilege granted us so that we can become worthy of the greater gifts he has in store for us.

Loving our neighbor—and in the Christian code this means all men no matter what may be their color, race or religion—is, according to our divine Lord, another most effective way of proving to God that we love him. Because of our common humanity we should be inclined to help our fellowmen, our neighbors, but the Christian law spiritualizes this natural inclination, by commanding us to help our neighbor because he is God's child. We are all fellow-children of God, members of the one family. Our heavenly Father loves each one of us and wants our salvation. If we love our common Father we will do all we can to help his other children also to attain salvation. It will earn for us God's favor.

If we observe these two commandments we are "fulfilling the whole law and the prophets,;" we are serving God and showing our gratitude to him for all his goodness to us. The Christian who is following Christ in love is already active in the earthly kingdom of God and traveling safely toward God's eternal kingdom of peace and happiness.
