By doing this, we are able to help more people who otherwise might be overlooked.

When you add someone to the list, you are responsible for distributing the basket of food to them or for making sure they are able to pick up the basket themselves.

When you call the office, please have the following information available:

- Family name
- Family size (broken down by the number of adults and kids)
- A contact number for the family
- Your name and phone number

Last year, we helped 19 families to have a better Christmas. The names we receive are given to us by parishioners who work in the community and see first hand the needs of these people. If a child is placed on the Angel Tree Program that family will receive a food basket from that program. Often, the names we receive are those who do not have kids, are elderly or are having a hard time because of the holiday season. 
Who Wants to Go to the March for Life?
