**Manifesting our Faith at  
Home**

As the Christmas Season draws to a close, Holy Mother Church celebrates the great Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. "Epiphany" literally means a manifestation or a showing forth. As the original Christmas, this was the day more highly regarded and celebrated because, while the birth of Christ brings great joy, on Epiphany he was made known to the world, represented by the Magi. Traditionally this is the day on which gifts are given, in imitation of the gifts given to the Child Jesus by the Magi. In

addition to this, the Church continues one of her most ancient traditions, that of the blessing of homes. Most of us have probably had our homes blessed at one time or another. But Epiphany gives the opportunity for a unique and special blessing particular to the day. Along with the prayer of blessing, which can be done by a priest or by the head of the household, the door lentil is "chalked"—marked in blessed chalk with a sign of the Epiphany: the year along with the letters C, M, and B. The acronym CMB stands for both a Latin prayer, Christus Mansionem Benedicat (May Christ Bless this House) as well as the traditional names of the Magi—Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar.

This year we are presented with another opportunity to "chalk the doors," as the expression goes. This outward sign of our celebration of Epiphany is a visible sign to all who enter our homes that they are entering the home of faithful Christian, one who rejoices in the manifestation of Christ in the world as its King and Savior, and one who proclaims year-round the joy that is the message of Christmas. As we have all been marked with the sign of the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation, this marking of our homes lets it be known to the all the world. True, the chalk mark will fade with time. But as it does we permit what the sign represents—our Faith—to sink more deeply into our hearts and mind, that it may be manifested more fully in our thoughts and actions.

Below is a very brief Rite of Blessing for Epiphany, and I encourage all our families at some point this week to take a moment to gather as a

household, to offer this prayer, and to "chalk the doors" in celebration of Our Lord's Epiphany.

**Epiphany Blessing**

*Gathering near the main entrance to the home, the head of the household leads the family in this short prayer service.*

V.\ In the name of the Father X and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.  
R.\ Amen.  
V.\ May peace dwell in this house.  
R.\ And in all who live here.

V.\ O God, by the guidance of a star you revealed your Only Begotten Son to the nations. Grant that we who know you by Faith in this life may come to live in your presence in the next.  
R.\ Amen.

V.\ Let us pray. Bless this home, Almighty God, that it may be a dwelling of health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to the Commandments, and thanksgiving to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. May this blessing remain upon this home, and upon all who live here, throughout this year. Through Christ our Lord.  
R.\ Amen.

*The head of the household then takes the blessed chalk and writes above the main door of the house, on the exterior, the following inscription:*

20 ✠ C ✠ M ✠ B ✠ 19



**Commentary for the Readings in the  
Extraordinary Form: Epiphany**

"There came Magi from the East to Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is the newly born King of the Jews?'. . . We have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him'" (Gospel).

Epiphany means "an apparition, or manifestation" of God becoming visible to the Gentile world. Today Jesus manifests a new "kingdom" (Introit), to which the star-light of "faith" guides all wise men (Prayer). The Epistle is a revealing picture of the "darkness" of the Jewish Old Testament; a prophecy also of the "brightness" of Christ shining in a world where men may now "see."

The Gospel tells of the faith of the "Magik" divinely guided by the "star"; how this faith manifested itself in action by their seeking instruction from God's priests, by prostrating their very beings and offering their best treasures before the frail Babe in Mary's arms: God in homage to His new Kingship, symbol of their hearts offering love; Incense in homage to His Divinity, symbol of their minds offering adoration; Myrrh in homage to His Humanity, symbol of their bodies offering to do penance. A truly great Feast! "Arise, be enlightened" (Epistle).

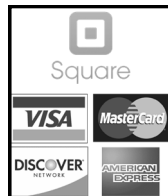

## Chalk Your Doors

This short liturgy is a way of marking our homes, usually at the front or main entrance, with sacred signs and symbols as we ask God's blessing upon those who live, work, or visit throughout the coming year. In Exodus, the Israelites marked their doors with blood so that the Lord would pass over their homes; but in this service, we mark our doors with chalk as a sign that we have invited God's presence and blessing into our homes

In Deuteronomy 6:9 God tells the people of Israel: "These words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house... You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." Chalking the door is a tangible way to honor God in our lives.

Please pick up a piece of blessed chalk before leaving the church today. The prayer for the chalking of the doors is on the front of this bulletin.



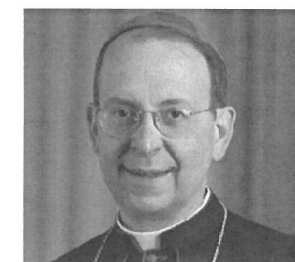
