The Most **Holy Trinity** he dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But I submit humbly and say: Lord, I believe, help my weak faith.

Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? It may be interpreted as a finale to all the preceding feasts. All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of redemption. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world as to give His only-begotten Son." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He ever remains the liturgist par excellence to whom we are united in all sacred functions. After Christ's ascension the Holy Spirit, however, became our Teacher, our Leader, our Guide, our Consoler. On solemn occasions a thanksgiving Te Deum rises spontaneously from Christian hearts.

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity may well be regarded as the Church's Te Deum of gratitude over all the blessings of the Christmas and Easter seasons; for this mystery is a synthesis of Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension and Pentecost. This feast, which falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, should make us mindful that actually every Sunday is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, that every Sunday is sanctified and consecrated to the triune God. Sunday after Sunday we should recall in a spirit of gratitude the gifts which the Blessed Trinity is bestowing upon us. The Father created and predestined us; on the first day of the week He began the work of creation. The Son redeemed us; Sunday is the "Day of the Lord," the day of His resurrection. The Holy Spirit sanctified us, made us His temple; on Sunday the Holy Spirit descended upon the infant Church. Sunday, therefore, is the day of the Most Holy Trinity.



Friends,

Most of you are aware by now of the Organ Renovation Project we are currently undertaking. As I have mentioned in past weeks, this year's Catholic Sharing Appeal is designated to help us defray the cost of the project. But I wanted to take a moment to give more details of the project.

The restoration of our pipe organ will involve two separate phases that will come together at the same time. The first is the full restoration of the existing pipe work, bellows, electronic relays, etc. The second is the expansion of our organ's capabilities with a newly-constructed and outfitted console. The most important aspect of this project will be that for the first time since its construction, our parish church will have an instrument that has been 100% customized for our worship space, meticulously voiced and balanced to make every corner ring with music glorifying God!

This is an ambitious project for our parish, especially after the renovation efforts which concluded only 5 years ago. As challenges have continued to abound in our Diocese, some would question the prudence of beginning an effort such as this. However, what strikes me most is the thought that these are the days when we are very much in need of returning to the most fundamental aspects of our Faith: Truth, Goodness, Beauty. Each of these is an aspect of who God is and how He makes Himself known to us. The beauty of the Church exists despite scandal and intrigue, giving us a foretaste of what we can expect in God's Heavenly Kingdom. Thus, those undertakings to enhance and further beautify our worship can only serve to unite us more to God.

Our pursuit of this project is more than merely an aesthetic choice or obtaining a new piece of furniture. Rather it is deeply rooted in the belief that when the world turns cold and dark we naturally seek those things which elevate our minds and hearts away from difficulty and help us to focus on what really matters: God Himself. It is no wonder that the most beautiful churches ever constructed were made during some of the most bleak and horrid periods of human history. Beauty matters. And it matters now more than ever.

As I have mentioned, the cost of the project will be significant. The total cost will be just shy of \$170,000. The Archbishop has authorized the beginning of the work, confident that we will be able to pay the cost. And he has assured me of his prayers for our success, saying how important such projects are for the life and future of the Church. As I mentioned above, the primary vehicle for funding this project will be through our Catholic Sharing Appeal. We are currently at 10% of our goal, but a far cry from the total cost of the project. I am asking all of our families to prayerfully consider how they can assist our parish in this endeavor. In addition to straight fundraising, I expect that we will be hosting a series of organ recitals to generate interest in the project and to help defray the cost of its completion.

Ultimately, the restoration of our organ is more than a fixer-upper project. It is a commitment on the part of our parish community to bring back to life something old and valuable, ensuring its life far into the future. It is a way of declaring that, despite our present difficulties in the Diocese and the Universal Church, St. Patrick's will remain for generations to come. This newly renovated pipe organ is a gift that we can leave to future generations of Catholics in Weston.
