



Why I Support the Organ Restoration Fund at St. Patrick Church

I've been asked this question, and here's my answer. First, I love sacred music – from classical (Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee), to traditional folk tunes (Go Forth with God's Blessing) to old time country gospel (I'll Fly Away). Yes, I even like Kum By Yah! Our rented organ may sound good now, but just think how our music will sound when our "real" organ is played. I'm so looking forward to hearing it in all its newly restored glory.

Second, I think of the legacy our church family from the past has given us. St. Patrick Church was founded by poor, immigrant factory workers and farmers who came here for a better life and wanted to worship God in the Catholic Church. Beginning with mass in people's homes, and through their sacrifices, the church has grown over the decades, and in the 1950's parishioners wanted their music to match their beautiful building. Through more sacrifice of funds large and small they were able to buy and install the organ we continue to enjoy. To honor their desire for beautiful music to worship the Lord, we should pass on that legacy to our own children, grandchildren and generations to come.

A week or so ago we received a donation in memory of a deceased parishioner, and I was so touched by that. What a wonderful gift to honor a loved one who was so dedicated to St. Patrick's. When we celebrate All Souls' Day you might consider who you might want to memorialize with a donation. And maybe, just maybe when the organ makes beautiful music glorifying God, if you listen real close, you might hear the voice of your loved one singing.

Parish Membership & Benefits:

To be considered an "active" member of any parish (and thus eligible for Sacraments, sponsor eligibility, and the "Active Parishioner Rate of tuition" at a Catholic school), the parish takes into account the following things. First, to receive a discount at a Catholic School or to receive a sacrament, the children MUST attend weekend Mass. Second, family & individual involvement in parish life and ministries are taken into consideration. Mass attendance is only able to be tracked accurately via collection envelopes. If you are not receiving envelopes currently, please contact the appropriate person at your parish. Parishioners over 18 should register as a household to help us keep records accurate and up-to-date.
