



Dear Friends,

As you are no doubt aware, the departure of our Fr. Cody Ford from our parishes earlier this month has left a void in many ways, not the least of which concerns my ability to effectively minister to, and provide Sacramental care to, all of our people, spread over multiple counties. At my urging, members of the Pastoral Councils of our respective parishes have spent the past few weeks speaking with you, and getting your input on what solutions can be found to ensure that our parish churches continue to have the Sacraments available to them, most especially in the celebration of Mass and the availability of confessions.

Last Thursday, January 9, I met with all three Pastoral Councils to hear their proposals and suggestions. A recommendation was made to me for a new weekend Mass schedule, which I submitted to Bishop Brennan for his approval. Through the miracle of modern technology, I was able to confer with Bishop Brennan via email whilst he was traveling back to Wheeling from his annual spiritual retreat. We went back and forth, asking and answering questions, and at the end he gave his approval to the new weekend schedule I will outline below.

Our New Mass Schedule will go into effect beginning on Saturday, February 1, 2020.

The schedule takes into account a great many factors, including geography, the age and well-being of our parishioners, and the overall feasibility of ensuring that Mass may be said at all our churches. Bishop Brennan, in giving approval to the schedule, has asked me to convey to all our parishioners his greetings and his gratitude for their patience and flexibility. He has also issued a word of thanks in a special way to the members of our Pastoral Councils, who were not charged with a fun or easy task, but whose "good sense and harmony are admirable."

As your pastor, I am aware that the new Mass times will not agree with every parishioner. As I mentioned back in November, a certain degree of change and patience will be required of all of us, and I pray that we might all see in this situation an opportunity to sanctify whatever inconvenience we may experience, to make the living out of our Faith a higher priority in our lives, and above all to work and pray more diligently to encourage the young men of our parish to prayerfully consider giving their lives in service to the Church as priests.

Please continue to pray for me and for all the priests of our Diocese. As I make my own spiritual retreat this coming week, please know that every one of you is in my prayers daily, and the intentions of our parish will especially be remembered at the Altar of our Lord.


