- Holy Communion will be distributed only under the species of the host. There will be no distribution of the Precious Blood.
- The Sigh of Peace, as called for in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, should be a "sober exchange" of peace. A bow of the head is sufficient for those who may be sick, or who are at risk to contact illness.
