



Commentary for the Readings in the Extraordinary Form: Septuagesima Sunday

"Why do you stand here all day idle? . . . Go you also into the vineyard" (Gospel).

As athletes of Christ we are called to a competitive "race" (Epistle). As workers "vineyard" (Gospel).

It is a "race" with death for the "prize" Blaise (February 3), St. Agatha prayers on the heart of our Mother of life eternal. Only "one receives the prize" by His own right, Christ! But, remember, He still runs in us if we do not lag in this "race," as did Israel under "Moses" (Epistle).

God comes to us "early" in life. Unitl the last "hour" He repeats, "Why . . stand . . . idle?" Each "hour" brings us nearer to the "evening" of reward, not due to the excellence of our work in itself but mercifully given by God as a recompense (Gospel).

Dear Brothers in Christ,


