

## Commentary for the Readings in the Extraordinary Form: Sexagesima Sunday

"Why do you stand here all day idle? . . . Go you also into the vineyard" (Gospel).

Every springtime God, as it were, rewrites the Book of Genesis and Creation. Appropriate to the coming spring, Jesus is now pictured as the Divine "Sower." He sows "seed" in the soil of our souls, covered with "rocks" of hardening pride, "thorns" of softening pleasures!

The Epistle is a vivid picture, moving in quick action over Europe and Asia, but above all moving our souls to action as it describes the sacrifices of Paul, the "sower," sowing the "word of God," passions despite within, persecutions from without.


## **Catholic Women's Book Club**
