St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross Novena

n Wednesday, I had a very fruitful meeting with Bishop Brennan. He visited St. Patrick's and toured the school, and after we talked about the upcoming school year and the many challenges that come with a parish school, he imparted to me words of encouragement and fatherly advice. Bishop Brennan has a great concern that the education that our parish schools provide must be authentically Catholic and that the teachers and students are motivated by the love of Christ. He said our schools have a duty to convey truth, especially the Truth of the Gospels and the Truth found in the teachings of the Church.

Bishop Brennan reminded me that when confronted with any challenge, I must first be intentional about praying, so he asked me to lead the Parish and school in a Novena and Litany to St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) because she was a brilliant philosopher and teacher. We will ask her to intercede for us with Jesus and Mary so that divine providence will send us a School Principal. An educator who loves Christ and his Church and will lead our teachers and students in the love of learning and the love of Christ.

Edith Stein (St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross) was born the youngest of eleven children into a devout Jewish family at Breslau, Germany. By her teenage years, she had become an atheist

A talented academic, Edith (St Teresa Benedicta) studied at the University of Breslau and received a Doctorate from Gottingen University. She then became a Teaching Assistant at various Universities. Through her studies and readings, notably the autobiography of St Teresa of Avila, she converted to Catholicism and resigned from her assistantship to teach in a Dominican convent school. During the following years, she produced many writings, including a translation of Thomas Aquinas' "Of Truth" into German; she also wrote to Pope Pius XI denouncing the Nazi regime for its abuses in Christ's name.

In 1932, St Teresa Benedicta entered the Discalced Carmelite Order. She was transferred to the Netherlands along with her sister (Rosa), who had likewise converted to Catholicism and joined the same Order. In 1942, they were arrested, as Jewish converts, along with 987 other Jews and taken to Auschwitz concentration camp. They were executed in a mass gas chamber, possibly on the 9th of August 1942.

Two words come to mind when I think about the amazing life of Edith Stein (St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross): Courage and Transformation.

"Christ embodies the ideal of human perfection...we are thus led through the imitation of Christ to the development of our original human vocation which is to present God's image in ourselves."

I think no greater quote can sum up the vocation of each individual. We live in a world where we are constantly defined by what we do or accomplish. For women, there is constant pressure to put on a brave face and be perfect. The culture tells you that it is not enough to be a stay-at-home mom; we must also have a career and make ourselves "useful," yet the working mother often feels that she somehow ruins her children or her family. For men, we are not defined by our relationship with God but by how much money we make or the position or title we have. Stein's writings and the witness of her life teach us such an important truth: We are called to be ourselves. And who are we? Children of God. Students at the feet of the Master. Receiving his divine teachings and allowing ourselves to become who we were created to be.

So please join with Bishop Brennan and me as we pray a Novena to St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross and a Litany of Our Lady of Good Counsel. We will Start the Novena at the Saturday and Sunday Masses, and I will lead the Novena on our parish Facebook page live every evening at 7 pm ending on St. Teresa Benedicta's Feast Day Monday, August 9.

I commend you all to the protection of St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross and St. Patrick.




