

## The Epiphany of the Lord

This Sunday, as we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord, it is important to remember the real symbolism of the feast. The magi came to the Christ-child at Herod's command, but they knew who they were going to venerate. They brought gifts of the highest quality. The Gold symbolized the power of Christ's kingship. The frankincense symbolized the high priesthood of Christ, who is both priest and sacrifice. Finally, the Myrrh, which symbolized the death that Christ was bound to face. Myrrh, was a spice which was wrapped with the body in the ancient Jewish Burial Traditions. As can be seen here, the coming of Christ, is inextricably intertwined with his passion and death, and, all of these things, are tied with the Old Testament.

All too often we see the Old Testament as something which is unimportant, and quite frankly ancient history, however, this could not be farther from the truth. Everything which happens in the New Testament, is foreshadowed in the Old Testament. A great example of this is the Epiphany Door Blessing, which is brought about in church history, to commemorate the coming of the magi to Christ. In the Book of Exodus, the Israelites brushed the tops of their doors with the blood of the slaughtered lamb, so that the Angel of death, which killed the firstborn of every family, knew that the homes which were marked with the blood belonged to the Israelites, God's chosen people.

In putting the Epiphany blessing over our doors, we show Satan and his demons, that we are God's chosen people. He is not welcome in our homes, and he is not welcome in our hearts. This blessing, which should be performed by the head of the household, is simply an external symbol of our belonging to God. In addition to its ties to the Old Testament, it is also tied to the New Testament feast of the Epiphany. The inscription which is written above the door, reads 20+C+M+B+22. The letters C,M, and B, are the first letters of each of the names of the Wise men. In addition, they are the first letters of the first three words (in Latin) of the blessing of a home by a priest. So please take a piece of chalk after mass today, and bless all the doors of your home to celebrate this great feast.

## When Should Catholics Not Receive Holy Communion?

- If you have a mortal sin on your soul. Some serious sins include (but are not limited to) being married outside the church, being unmarried but living together or purposely not attending Sunday Mass or holy days of obligation. For more info on what constitutes a mortal sin, refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1857 1859.
- If you have not observed the Eucharistic Fast one hour before receiving. Plan to eat your breakfast after Mass!
- If you have not yet received First Communion.

#### Why Can't Non-Catholics Receive Holy Communion?

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion.

For those who cannot receive Eucharist at this time, we welcome you to join in our liturgy, to pray and sing with us. Please remain in the pew during the Communion Procession, offering your heartfelt prayers to our God of love and mercy. We eagerly await the time when you will join us at the Eucharistic table!


