We Are All Sinners Joe Derico

he Roman Canon, or first eucharistic prayer, is the prayer which is said during the liturgy of the eucharist, which contains the words of consecration of the Eucharist. The last oration of this prayer has recently struck me in a particular manner which compelled me to write this reflection.

I am an unapologetic liturgy nerd. The Sacred Liturgy feeds me, not just with the bread of eternal life, but also with abundant graces, which have allowed me to have so many opportunities, and which fostered my vocation.

Returning to the Roman Canon, let us discuss for a moment, the traditions of the roman rite, specifically with regards to what is known as the Traditional Latin Mass. The entire Canon in that mass, was said in silence; not even the words of consecration were said audibly, yet there is one single exception. The priest says the words "nobis quoque peccatoribus" out loud, so that all of those in the church can hear. Now I am sure that you must be thinking (unless you are familiar with ecclesiastical Latin) that this phrase must hold some theological significance, and while this is true, it is not the main purpose. These words translate to the phrase used in the missal of Paul VI (English) as, "To us also, though sinners". Thus, in the only words spoken aloud during the canon the priest was acknowledging out loud to the entire church, that he was a sinner.

The sheer profundity of this statement should strike us as something which guides our understanding of the Christian life. As I spent my holy hour of adoration one afternoon, meditating upon this phrase, and the manner which the rubrics dictate it is used in the missal of John XXIII (Latin), I really wished that I could appreciate more fully those words, when used in the missal of Paul VI. I think all too often, both myself and others, let these words simply slide by as a throwaway line in the canon, which is not important, but I believe above that I have shown the contrary.

In addition to these things, this reminded me of one of the most famous speeches ever given by the Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen, who was a revolutionary catholic evangelist in the 20th century, and had a show on CBS, for which he won an Emmy. He also wrote some 66 books on the life of our Lord, the blessed mother, the priesthood, and other important topics. During the presidency of Jimmy Carter, the president asked Archbishop Sheen to speak. The event has been well attended since its inception in 1953, and had some 3,500 guests, which included, Billy Graham, presidents and dignitaries from around the world, and many congressmen and senators. Sheen loved the get the attention of his audience the start and in this and away he rarely

from the start, and in this endeavor, he rarely failed, but he outdid himself on this morning.

Sheen took the podium, and at 5' 7" he was far from an imposing figure. He looked out across the crowd, and then said in his booming voice, "Mr. President", then turning to face the president at the table next to the podium, "You are a sinner." Needless to say, he had the attention of everyone in the room at this point, then he points at himself, and says "I am a sinner, we are all sinners, and we need to turn to God." Billy Graham, who is known as one of the best television evangelists to ever live, in the same class as Sheen, later commented that it was "the finest sermon that he ever heard." The comment has become as well renowned as the famous line by President Ronald Regan, who said, "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall." I don't know about you all, but I still get chills each time that I have watched Regan say that line, and I imagine that Sheen's line had that same effect on all of those in the room.

Sheen had one point in making this brazen comment, we are all, no matter social class or perceived importance, sinners. This story, along with the line from the Roman Canon, should help us all to perceive this more clearly. We are all sinners, yet, God is merciful. He gives us the incredible graces of forgiveness in the sacrament of confession, and we have to recognize it as such. When was the last time you took advantage of God's mercy? When was the last time you found that grace in sacramental confession? Are you living in a state of sin?

These are the essential questions that this line from the canon, and that Archbishop Sheen sought to ask. We must see confession as a form of Mercy, because that is simply all that it is, and while it is comfortable to simply "confess my sins to God alone", the church has always held that sacramental confession is the easiest way to this mercy, and in fact, requires that her members go at least once a year, but I would ask, when was the last time you went? Why don't you go?

Believe me, I hate acknowledging my sins in confession, it hurts in some ways, to disclose them, even though I know that my confession is under the seal. I have long attributed this feeling to the Devil. Satan wants us to feel bad about our sins, and so he makes us feel that way, when we are saying them, but once the priest prays the prayer of absolution, we are set free from any attachment to Satan, and we can then realize the error of not going to confession. So even if it has been decades since your last confession, just give that to God, because he is merciful, and he loves each of us, and desires that we are with him in heaven.

We eagerly await the time when you will join us at the Eucharistic table!

Parish Membership & Benefits:

To be considered an "active" member of any parish (and thus eligible for Sacraments, sponsor eligibility, and the "Active Parishioner Rate of tuition" at a Catholic school), the parish takes into account the following things. First, to receive a discount at a Catholic School or to receive a sacrament, the children MUST attend weekend Mass. Second, family & individual involvement in parish life and ministries are taken into consideration. Mass attendance is only able to be tracked accurately via collection envelopes. If you are not receiving envelopes currently, please contact the parish office. Parishioners over 18 should register as a household to help us keep records accurate and up-to-date.


Snow Day Fun


