The Sacred Season of Lent

Austere is the watchword for the liturgical celebrations of the sacred season of Lent. The Church has proclaimed a time of fasting and self-denial and she teaches by example. The priest is vested in violet, the gloomy color of penance and mortification, except on the Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare “Rejoice” Sunday) when he wears the festive rose vestments. The sanctuary is bereft of flowers, and less ornate linens and candlesticks adorn the altar. The Gloria will not be prayed on Sunday, while the Alleluia will be entirely absent throughout Lent.

The use of musical instruments is limited to the accompaniment of singing. Weddings are discouraged during Lent and in fact, all celebrations should be characterized by restraint. Even the feast days of Saints are observed in a reduced manner, with the priest wearing the violet of the season rather than the red or white of the saint. By this penitential ‘fast of the senses’, Holy Mother Church prepares our hearts for a jubilant Easter renewal.

There are two exceptions to the Lenten austerity. On the Solemnities of St. Joseph (March 19) and the Annunciation (March 25) the Church sets aside her purple for white vestments, sings the Gloria and prays the Creed. (We genuflect at the “et Incarnatus est” on the Annunciation.) The Solemnity of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church and foster father of Christ, is a feast of highest rank—in some countries it’s even a civil holiday! On the Solemnity of the Annunciation, we celebrate a feast that propels us into the Christmas mystery. Jesus, the Savior who will shortly give his life for our sins, is this day conceived in the Virgin Mary’s womb. Her “fiat” (“Let it be done unto me...”) to an angel, will undo the subjection to sin caused by Eve’s “yes” to a fallen-angel. This is indeed the most sublime moment in the history of time.

Ash Wednesday inaugurates the Lenten Season, and its readings set the guidelines for our 40-day journey. The Gospel gives us our Lenten “marching orders”: pray, fast, and give alms, not for outward show but with hearts that are converted. We receive the sacramental ashes as testimony to our desire to do penance and bear our cross after Jesus. Subsequent Scripture readings of the Lenten Liturgies give us daily lessons based on three major themes:

- 1) The first three weeks call us to repentance and to the practice of virtue, though the Church will suspend her penitential readings on Laetare Sunday, the midway point of the Lenten journey, to rejoice that Easter is near.
- 2) The second theme that threads its way through the seasonal readings is the instruction of the catechumens who are preparing for Easter-birth. The Rites of Christian Initiation span the season of Lent and culminate in the Easter Vigil Rites of Baptism and Confirmation of the Elect. The various readings put before our eyes many Old Testament characters and events that prefigure Christ and the Paschal Mystery: Christ is the new Adam, and he is the Isaac of the New Covenant; the Church is the new Ark which saves mankind through the waters of Baptism, etc.
- 3) The final scriptural theme unfolding in the last two weeks of Lent is the mounting opposition of the Jews toward Christ. The sixth and final Sunday of Lent (Passion or Palm Sunday) will usher in Holy Week, the greatest and holiest of all weeks.

When Should Catholics Not Receive Holy Communion?

- If you have a mortal sin on your soul. Some serious sins include (but are not limited to) being married outside the church, being unmarried but living together or purposely not attending Sunday Mass or holy days of obligation. For more info on what constitutes a mortal sin, refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1857 - 1859.
- If you have not observed the Eucharistic Fast one hour before receiving. Plan to eat your breakfast after Mass!
- If you have not yet received First Communion.

Why Can't Non-Catholics Receive Holy Communion?

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion.

For those who cannot receive Eucharist at this time, we welcome you to join in our liturgy, to pray and sing with us. Please remain in the pew during the Communion Procession, offering your heartfelt prayers to our God of love and mercy. We eagerly await the time when you will join us at the Eucharistic table!

Parish Membership & Benefits:

To be considered an "active" member of any parish (and thus eligible for Sacraments, sponsor eligibility, and the "Active Parishioner Rate of tuition" at a Catholic school), the parish takes into account the following things. First, to receive a discount at a Catholic School or to receive a sacrament, **the children MUST attend weekend Mass**. Second, family & individual involvement in parish life and ministries are taken into consideration. Mass attendance is only able to be tracked accurately via collection envelopes. If you are not receiving envelopes currently, please contact the parish office. Parishioners over 18 should register as a household to help us keep records accurate and up-to-date.

Social Studies Fair

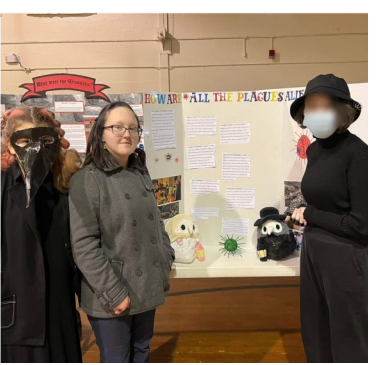
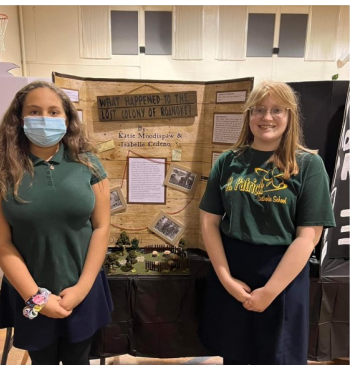
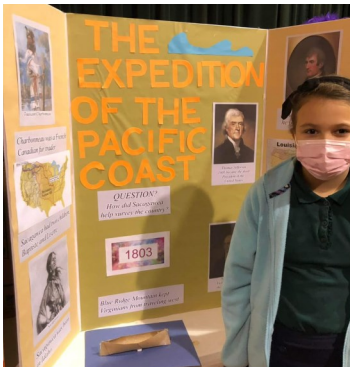
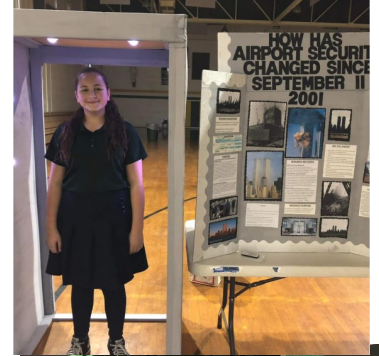
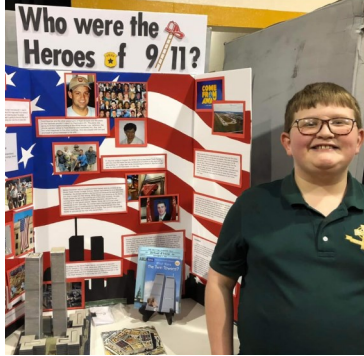

The Third Precept of the Church

You shall receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter Season

This precept of the Church seems like a no brainer. You might remark "I receive communion every time I go to mass." This sentiment however was not always that common, Catholics as early as the turn of the 20th century only received communion once a year, because the sacraments weren't always available to them, or because they considered themselves unworthy to receive our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. With that in mind, we must see the Blessed Sacrament as a gift to us from God, rather than a right which we have as Catholics. This is why the church says that we must be in the state of grace (absence of sin) in order to receive the Blessed Sacrament, because it is not a right, it is a privilege.

So, while the church commands us to receive holy communion at least once per year, we must receive our Lord worthily. In order to do this, we must observe the first two precepts of the church as well as the third. We must go to confession and to mass, before we are worthy to receive our Lord in the eucharist. So, the next time you go up the aisle to receive communion, take a minute to see if you are really worthily receiving our Lord. And if you aren't, then get to confession, there is no shame in going, but there is a lot of shame in not going.
