## **Happy Grandparents Day!**

On the first Sunday after Labor Day we celebrate National Grandparents Day. This year the date falls on September 11. Like Mother's day and Father's day we also have a whole day dedicated to our grandparents. Grandparents and children have a special connection that is proven to both make grandparents live longer, and also make children more emotionally resilient. Grandparents Day is an opportunity to treasure that connection and spend some quality family time together.

#### **History of Grandparents Day**

In 1969, nine-year-old Russell Capper sent President Nixon a letter suggesting that a day should be set aside in order to celebrate grandparents. On June 12, 1969, he received a letter back from Rose Mary Woods — Personal Secretary to the President — reading, "Dear Russell, Thank you for your letter to President Nixon. Your suggestion regarding a Grandparent's Day is appreciated, but the President ordinarily issues proclamations designating periods for special observance only when a Congressional resolution authorizes him to do so. With best wishes, Sincerely, Rose Mary Woods Personal Secretary to the President."

Following this letter, Marian McQuade was recognized nationally by the U.S. Senate and by President Jimmy Carter as the founder of National Grandparents Day. McQuade wanted to educate the youth about the importance of seniors and the contributions they have made throughout history. She urged the youth to "adopt" a grandparent and learn more about their lives, challenges, and desires for the future.

In 1977, Senator Randolph, with the help of other senators, introduced a joint resolution to the senate requesting the president to "issue annually proclamation designating the Sunday of September after Labor Day of each year as 'National Grandparents' Day'." Congress passed the legislation, proclaiming the first Sunday after Labor Day as National Grandparent's Day. On August 3, 1978, Jimmy Carter signed the proclamation, and the day was finally celebrated the following year.

## **State Pro-Life Convention, October 1, 2022**

With the reversal of Roe v. Wade, the pro-life movement has been given a new direction. We can now ban abortion, but this provides new challenges for the pro-life movement. West Virginians for Life will host the Annual Pro-Life Convention on October 1, 2022 at Trinity Assembly of God in Fairmont from 10 to 3. WVFL is planning a program to prepare the pro-life movement to deal with these new challenges. This year's theme is Love Them All: Loving Hearts and Saving Lives. Key-note speaker Olivia Gans Turner will help us reply to the arguments of our pro-abortion opponents. Byron Calhoun, M.D., Perinatologist, will explain why abortion is not health care. Olivia Gans Turner and Wanda Franz, Ph.D. will describe the damage abortion does to women. Missy Ciccarello will show why adoption is the loving solution to an unwanted pregnancy. Sadie Shields, Legislative Director, will discuss the legislative status here in West Virginia. #### When Should Catholics Not Receive Holy Communion?

- If you have a mortal sin on your soul. Some serious sins include (but are not limited to) being married outside the church, being unmarried but living together or purposely not attending Sunday Mass or holy days of obligation. For more info on what constitutes a mortal sin, refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1857 - 1859.
- If you have not observed the Eucharistic Fast one hour before receiving. Mints and gum break your fast.
- If you have not yet received First Communion.

#### Why Can't Non-Catholics Receive Holy Communion?

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion.

For those who cannot receive Eucharist at this time, we welcome you to join in our liturgy, to pray and sing with us. Please remain in the pew during the Communion Procession, offering your heartfelt prayers to our God of love and mercy. We eagerly await the time when you will join us at the Eucharistic table!


