


All parish and school employees and volunteers who are 18 and older in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston need to be Virtus compliant. Our number one priority is keeping our children and vulnerable adults safe.

A detailed list of who is considered a volunteer can be found on the diocesan website (dwc.org) in the policy handbook. The list

includes readers, money counters, adult altar servers, funeral luncheon workers, choir members, those who volunteer at special events, picnics, and dinners, those who go to school field trips, attend class parties, work in the library, read to the kids, help with Catholic Schools Week activities, etc.

If you have completed Virtus training in the past, you already have an account but you need to e-sign a few new agreements, possibly due a continuing training, and update your background check if it has been more than three years since you last had one through our Virtus program. #### Dear Saint Patrick's Parishioners,

I hope you all are doing well and living both prayerfully and fruitfully! As our school year at Saint John Paul II Seminary has come to a close, I wish to inform you that I have discerned out of priestly formation and will not be returning to the seminary in the fall. This decision has by no means come lightly, but rather through much prayer, reflection, and an abundance of formation.

Prior to entering the seminary, Joe Derico told me that a man "can't leave the seminary worse off than when he entered." This has been extraordinarily truthful as I have seen not only myself grow, but also each one of my brother seminarians. Seminary is both a house of formation and a house of discernment. In discerning out of the seminary, one does not 'fail,' but rather is one step closer to fulfilling God's will. My time in the seminary has undoubtedly been the most formative and enriching of my life. It has helped me grow not only as a man but also in my identity as a beloved son of God. The lessons I have learned and the formation I have received will certainly shape the way I live the rest of my life, and it is my hope that I can share even a morsel of these abundant gifts with you all. Through total surrender and abandonment to Christ, that morsel will be multiplied far greater than any of us can even imagine.

In his book, *Rekindling Wonder*, my seminary spiritual director Fr. Seith writes that "when sacrificial worship shapes our lives, we see with God's eyes and experience the joy of love."1 In my time at JPII Seminary, through example and witness, I have had the joy of more fully experiencing this life-changing love. In discerning out of seminary, my overarching goal does not shift, but rather how I live it out. God thirsts for our love – He thirsts for it to be freely given to Him.2 I wholeheartedly desire and aim to freely give Him my love, to see the face of Christ in each person I meet, and to recognize every action of my life as "part of the romance between [myself] and God."3 Both by word and example, I hope to encourage you all to strive for the same.

You all have been in my prayers in a special way this year, and I know that you have kept me in your own as well. Your kindness and support have been greatly felt and appreciated throughout this journey. Father Seith taught me that in life, "we find ourselves in an adventure; we 'land' in one. All that matters on our end is our response."4 Let us strive to have a 'response' that orients everything in our lives towards the Divine, so that through us and in us, God may work more abundantly to show His love to all. May God bless you all.
