Why Can't Non-Catholics Receive Holy Communion?

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion. For those who cannot receive Eucharist at this time, we welcome you to join in our liturgy, to pray and sing with us. Please remain in the pew during the Communion Procession, offering your heartfelt prayers to our God of love and mercy. We eagerly await the time when you will join us at the Eucharistic table!

When Should Catholics Not Receive Holy Communion?

- · If you have a mortal sin on your soul. Some serious sins include (but are not limited to) being married outside the church, being unmarried but living together or purposely not attending Sunday Mass or holy days of obligation. For more info on what constitutes a mortal sin, refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1857 1859.
- If you have not observed the Eucharistic Fast one hour before receiving. Mints and gum break your fast.
- · If you have not yet received First Communion.

To the Faithful of St. Patrick's,

I was a protestant almost all of my life and the concept of the real presence in the Eucharist was very foreign to me. The protestant churches I attended passed out "communion" but it was made very clear that the bread and wine were only symbols. There was far more reverence for the coffee and donuts that were made available before church than communion. My conversion to Catholicism has changed my view of "communion". In fact, the Catholic teaching on the Eucharist is one of the reasons I became Catholic (the sacrament of reconciliation was another reason). The Catholic Church offers us salvation in the sacraments, and the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of Christian life. It makes us more like Jesus and receiving it takes away venial sins! The procession around the block was very powerful for me because it shows that we really believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist. My hope is that next year our parish will be packed on Corpus Christi so all of us can stand shoulder to shoulder as we process around the block. May we always be proud to proclaim the power of the Eucharist!

Processional Canopy Donation

We hope everyone had a chance to see and appreciate that we now have a canopy for our Eucharistic processions. We were able to purchase the canopy due to an anonymous donation from a parishioner. We have been looking for a processional canopy for a few years since the ombrellino that we have is for transferring the Eucharist indoors. Such as from the main altar to the side altar on Holy Thursday.

Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulcher

Who are the Knights and Dames you may see wearing regalia with the Cross of Pope Urban more commonly known as the Jerusalem Cross? These are members of a Religious Order known as the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher (EOHS). Pope Urban II (around 1090) formed the order and gave it its charge to care for and protect the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem. The order was later placed under the Direction of the Franciscans. With the renewal of the Second Vatican Council a new constitution for the order was approved by Paul VI. John Paul II made the Order a legal canonical order constituted by the Holy See.

Today the Order and its 30,000 members around the world serve the Church with particular support for Christians in the Holy Land. The order is involved with promoting peace, building schools, and assisting Churches in the Holy Land - all under the direction of the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem. Members typically wear the vestments of the order as part of Liturgical Processions within their Diocese and as part of Liturgies Celebrated by the Order including on the Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of Palestine (October 25), Feast of the Holy Cross (September 14), Memorial of St. Pius X (August 21), and the Memorial of St. Helena (August 18). There are currently a dozen members in our Diocese.
