

SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

November 26, 2023

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King. In a world filled with various forms and types of leadership and authority, we look to Jesus as our true king, the one who reigns with love, compassion, and selflessness.

The gospel passage from Matthew 25 presents a powerful image of Christ as the ultimate king and judge. He separates the sheep from the goats, not based on their wealth, status, or achievements, but on their acts of love and mercy. The king we honor is one who identifies himself with the hungry, thirsty, stranger, naked, sick, and imprisoned. He calls us to recognize his presence in the least of our brothers and sisters.

Ezekiel's prophecy paints a picture of God as the good shepherd, caring for God's flock. This passage reminds us that our king is not distant or indifferent but deeply involved in our lives. God seeks out the lost, binds up the injured, and strengthens the weak. Our shepherd-king knows each one of us by name and desires that none of us should be lost.

As we reflect on these readings, we are challenged to examine our lives. Do we recognize Christ as our king and allow him to reign in our hearts? Do we follow his example of humble service and selflessness in our leadership roles, whether in our families, communities, or workplaces?

In a world that often values power, wealth, and success, Christ's kingship stands in stark contrast. He reigns not by force but by love. He leads not with arrogance but with humility. He serves not for personal gain but for the well-being of others. This is the kind of leadership that our world desperately needs.

As we honor Christ the King, let us surrender our lives to His loving rule. Let us allow Him to be the King of our hearts, guiding us in acts of kindness, compassion, and love. Let us be a community that serves the least among us, recognizing the presence of our King in their faces. (Sr. Maria Ukamaka Clare Okeke)

When Should Catholics Not Receive Holy Communion?

- If you have a mortal sin on your soul. Some serious sins include (but are not limited to) being married outside the church, being unmarried but living together or purposely not attending Sunday Mass or holy days of obligation. For more info on what constitutes a mortal sin, refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1857 - 1859.
- If you have not observed the Eucharistic Fast one hour before receiving. Mints and gum break your fast.
- If you have not yet received First Communion.

Why Can't Non-Catholics Receive Holy Communion?

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion.

For those who cannot receive Eucharist at this time, we welcome you to join in our liturgy, to pray and sing with us. Please remain in the pew during the Communion Procession, offering your heartfelt prayers to our God of love and mercy. We eagerly await the time when you will join us at the Eucharistic table!

A Eucharistic Revival Initiative

The Presence of God

As an evangelical protestant, there was always a lot of emphasis on “feeling the presence of God.” I valued a deep intimacy with our Lord but didn’t really know how to achieve it. Typically “feeling God’s presence” was always chalked up to emotions during services and personal prayer, but, what was to be done when feelings faded? Had God abandoned me?

I didn’t have many friends who cared about the faith as a teenager, which made it difficult to grow in mine. Eventually, a new girl moved to my school who radiated virtue and joy and I knew I wanted to be her friend. She really seemed like the kind of person who had God’s presence within them. I remember just bluntly asking her in 8th grade, “Your family goes to church, don’t they?”

“Oh, yes! Every Sunday!” she said excitedly. I knew it, she didn’t have to tell me. People (teenagers especially) simply were not that joyful without the light of Christ.

I learned that she was Catholic. Growing up, the title “Catholic” on a church building meant the same thing to me as “Methodist,” or “Baptist.” I simply thought it was another title that didn’t carry a significant meaning as to what went on inside the church as all of the churches that I had attended were a relatively similar, “hymn-sandwich” style (hymn, preaching, hymn). That all changed when I went to Mass with her one Sunday morning. Mass was more different than I could have imagined. The priest wore fancy robes, people were saying things in unison that I didn’t know, and there was much sitting, standing, and kneeling at unfamiliar times. The most significant difference, though, was during communion. My Church had communion only once a year, and here we were on an ordinary Sunday having communion! The way the man in the fancy robes did communion was much different than the way my pastors had. He stood at a table, said many, many words, and elevated the bread and cup. I had never seen this before. When it came time to receive communion, my friend whispered to me “Cross your arms across your chest.” I thought perhaps I had heard her wrong. Nobody else was doing that and that’s certainly not how I did it in my church. She went up to receive, and I did too, simply sticking my hands out and looking at the priest. I stood there for what felt like an eternity as the priest, knowing his flock very well, recognized that I was a visitor. He asked “Are you Catholic?” I continued to stand there, not knowing what to say. He asked again, “Are you Catholic?” My friend, in a panic, came back and grabbed me by the arm, “Oh no, no, sorry Father.” I was incredibly confused as to why I couldn’t receive communion as a Christian since I could in all of the other churches that I had attended. I didn’t know what being “Catholic” had to do with anything. The priest approached me after Mass and kindly said, “If you have any questions about the faith, please feel welcomed to ask.” This was also confusing to me. Questions about “the faith?” Did he not know that I was a Christian and had been my whole life?

Many years had passed but that experience never left me. My friend and I laughed about it from time to time, and I certainly learned to cross my arms over my chest when attending Mass with her. She always accepted me, but never hesitated to correct me when I was wrong. I loved learning from her as she explained to me the brown scapular, the rosary, and stories of the saints. Catholicism was beautiful, but to me, it wasn’t “necessary.” I was always taught that you just needed to believe in Jesus and all other things were just hoops to jump through.

My friend and I went to college together- our greatest adventure yet! At that time, I began taking the study of religion seriously at the academic level and, being at a protestant school, that meant studying with an anti-Catholic lens. This drove a serious wedge between us as I became more aggressively opposed to her views as I studied the scriptures and stood on the false premise of “Scripture Alone.”

It wasn't until one summer when I took some extra credit hours studying biblical Greek with my professor that I realized the holy scriptures pointed to the Church and her teachings. Our assignment was to take a word or phrase from a biblical passage and study it thoroughly in the original Greek language. Out of curiosity, I chose John 6:55 which reads, "For My flesh is *true* food, and My blood is *true* drink" which is a part of the bread of life discourse where Jesus teaches that unless you eat his flesh and drink his blood you have no life in him. Protestants typically didn't comment on this passage, and I knew what Catholics believed. Surely reading this passage in Greek would help me to get closer to what Jesus truly meant. What did he mean by "true" food?

Zoning in on that word, "true," from John 6:55, which is Ἀληθής (alethes) in Greek, I discovered it's meaning as true, in fact, *undeniable reality when something is fully tested*, authentic.

The Lord had used my own errors to lead me to the truth. As I was looking only to the scriptures for answers the Lord led me directly to his own words: that his body was true, undeniable, authentic food and his blood true, undeniable, authentic drink. I asked my professor his thoughts. He simply stated, "Well I'm protestant, but that's what it says." I always appreciated his academic integrity in that moment.

Jesus was truly present in the Eucharist and there was no way I could squirm away from that truth. Jesus's words were literal, not symbolic. Catholics were right about the Eucharist.

I began my journey of conversion with one thing in mind: receiving the Eucharist. I had the confidence that my lifelong struggle with having God's presence within me was solved- he was truly present under the forms of bread and wine, and to have his life within me, I must partake! Upon receiving our Eucharistic Lord for the first time, I had no supernatural experience. There was no music playing. There was no "hype" or fiery preaching to stir my emotions. There was only Jesus in the Eucharist.

There only ever needed to be Jesus in the Eucharist.



Confirmation Update

Catechist Missy Jordan taught the confirmation class about faith. Hebrews 11:1 states: "Now faith is the certainty of things hoped for, a proof of things not seen." Missy expanded on this lesson by blindfolding confirmation candidate, Johna Cunningham, and guiding her to a chair. Johna had to practice trusting her teacher even though she could not see her as we do with God.



Prepare the Way for the Lord Advent begins, Sunday, December 2



Advent comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." Jesus is coming, and Advent is intended to be a season of preparation for His arrival. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance and fasting are appropriate during this season.

Advent is not as strict as Lent, and there are no rules for fasting, but it is meant to be a period of self-preparation. The purple color associated with Advent is also the color of penance. The faithful should fast during the first two weeks in particular and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The color of the Third Sunday of Advent is rose. This color symbolizes joy and represents the happiness we will experience when Jesus comes again. The Third Sunday is a day of anticipatory celebration. It is formerly called "Gaudete" Sunday; gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin.

Finally, Sundays during Advent, just as during Lent, should not be given to fasting, but instead to celebration because we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord every Sunday. It is important to remember, however, there are no particular rules for how the laity should observe Advent.

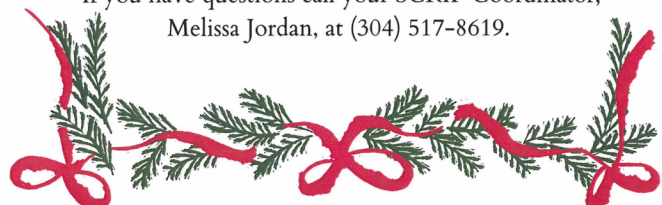
