
St. Patrick's

SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER & PAUL

Veneration of the two great Apostles, Saints Peter and Paul, has its roots in the very foundations of the Church. They are the solid rock on which the Church is built. the origin of her faith and will forever remain her protectors and her guides. To them Rome owes her true greatness, for it was under God's providential guidance that they were led to make the capital of the Empire, sanctified by their martyrdom, the center of the Christian world whence should radiate the preaching of the Gospel. St. Peter suffered martyrdom under Nero. in A.D. 66 or 67. He was buried on the hill of the Vatican where recent excavations have revealed his tomb on the very site of the Basilica of St. Peter's. St. Paul was beheaded in the Via Ostia on the spot where now stands the basilica bearing his name. Down the centuries Christian people in their thousands have gone on pilgrimage to the tombs of these Apostles. In the second and third centuries the Roman Church already stood pre-eminent by reason of her apostolicity, the infallible truth of her teaching and her two great figures, Sts. Peter and Paul. 

Martyrdom & Road Rage

Throughout the two thousand years since Christ established his church there have been many holy Martyrs who have shown us in the most beautiful way how to follow the way of self-sacrificial love. One you may be familiar with is St. Maximilian Kolbe. He was martyred in Auschwitz's on August 14th 1941 after volunteering to take the place of a fellow prisoner in the starvation chamber. He is most commonly thought of as a beautiful example of the self-sacrificial love Christ speaks of in the Gospel of John:

"Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." (John 15:13 RSV)

Less then a year later in the Dachau concentration camp in southern Germany about 370 miles away there was another great saint suffering for his Faith. His name is St. Titus Brandsma. A Dutch Carmelite priest who similarly to Maximilian Kolbe was imprisoned for opposing Nazi ideology. He was brought into the "infirmary" on June 19th 1942. He was already put on the "death list" by the time he arrived meaning he was brought in to be experimented on and tortured by nurses and doctors rather than suffering as a working member of a labor camp.

In his room there was a nurse that "cared" for him. She was the one who both subjected him to frequent forms of torture and spoke with him more than anyone else. The nurse's name was Irmgard Grünewald. She recounts that unlike every other prisoner she tortured, Titus never cursed or scolded her.

Instead Irmgard said that she distinctly remembers a day in which he grabbed her hand and with a fatherly love looked her in the eye saying "You poor, poor girl, I'll pray for you!" The elderly priest gave her his rosary and loved her everyday she came in to aid in his torture regimen. It so happened that the duty fell on Irmgard to inject carbonic acid into his blood stream effectively killing the holy priest. Titus Brandsma was martyred on July 25th 1942. In his suffering he showed the deep charity and love of God of a man fully conformed to Christ and because of his love and witness the very women who killed him found the love of Christ in his death. She recounts simply "He had compassion for me." Irmgard converted to the Catholic faith and testified in the canonical process for his canonization. St. Titus Brandsma was canonized on May 15th, 2022 in St. Peter's square. His life along with St. Maximilian Kolbe's show us the powerful grace at work through our acts of charity. A charity that comes only from a deep interior peace. A deep interior peace that comes from knowing

you are loved by Christ and that by giving your life in love to every single person you encounter you are loving Christ as you ought. Our Lord said when asked about the greatest commandment:

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets." (Matthew 22:37-40 RSV)

One man laid down his life for a total stranger while the other committed his last days to the effective conversion of his murderer. We all see Christ in these great men. Even those who don't believe and those who hate Christ and His Church see Christ in them.

Can we say the same for our own lives? Do we make people think of our Lord by the way we speak to them? By the way we work for them? By the way we parent them? By how we deal with them when they hog the left lane going 10 miles under the speed limit on I-79?

A good practice is to keep the lives of the saints and above all- the life of Christ in the forefront of our minds. If you've got on your mind, for example, the conversion of Irmgard Grünewald when someone cuts you off in traffic— it might just be a little bit easier to say a Hail Mary for them instead of making an angry gesture.
