As we begin the season of Advent, a time of hopeful anticipation and preparation, the Church invites us to enter into a period of watchfulness and reflection. This Sunday's Gospel reminds us to "stay awake" and be vigilant, for we do not know the hour of the Lord's coming (Matthew 24:42–44). Advent is not merely a countdown to Christmas; rather, it calls us to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ in three profound ways.

First, we prepare to celebrate the historical birth of Jesus, the Incarnation of God's love in Bethlehem. This aspect of Advent invites us to contemplate the humility and simplicity of Christ's coming into the world, inspiring us to embrace these virtues in our own lives.

Second, we are called to recognize Christ's presence among us today—in the Eucharist, in Scripture, and in the faces of those in need. Advent is a powerful reminder to be attentive to how we encounter Christ in our daily interactions and to respond with charity and compassion.

Finally, Advent urges us to look forward to the second coming of Christ, when He will establish His kingdom in its fullness. This eschatological hope challenges us to live lives of holiness and justice, so we may be found ready and worthy at His return.

As we light the first candle on the Advent wreath, let its flame be a symbol of the light of Christ dispelling the darkness in our hearts and in the world. May this Advent season be a time of renewal, drawing us closer to the Lord in prayer, repentance, and acts of love.

How will you make room in your heart for the coming of the King of Kings during this sacred season? May the grace of Advent lead us to a deeper encounter with Christ, whose coming we prepare to joyfully celebrate.


Our Neighbor Collection


Social Studies Fair


