On this Third Sunday of Advent—Gaudete Sunday—we are invited to rejoice, even as we wait. Today's Gospel gives us a powerful lesson in what Christian joy truly is. From his prison cell, John the Baptist sends his disciples to Jesus with a question that echoes the longing of every human heart: "Are you the One who is to come?" This is not doubt so much as yearning. John, who spent his life preparing the way, wants reassurance that the Messiah has indeed arrived.

Jesus does not respond with theories or titles. He points to what is happening: the blind see, the lame walk, the dead are raised, the poor hear good news. In other words, the Kingdom is breaking in—quietly, mercifully, unmistakably. Joy, for Jesus, is not an emotion but a sign that God is at work.

Gaudete Sunday reminds us that Christian joy is born not from perfect circumstances, but from the certainty that Christ is near, already healing, restoring, and

renewing what is broken. Even in John's confinement—his waiting, his suffering—God's saving work continues.

Jesus then turns to the crowd and praises John as the greatest of the prophets, yet adds a stunning truth: "The least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." In Christ, we are given a dignity beyond anything the world can offer. We live not just awaiting the Messiah—He is already with us.

As we light the rose candle this week, we are invited to look again at our own lives. Where is Christ already moving? What signs of hope, mercy, or healing have quietly taken root? Advent joy grows when we can recognize and receive these signs, however small.

May this Gaudete Sunday strengthen our hope, deepen our joy, and open our eyes to the presence of the One who has already come and who continues to come to us each day.

How to Go to Confession Guide



Scan for an examination of conscience guide

Before confession, make a thorough and prayerful examination of conscience, reflecting on the sins committed since your last confession. Write your sins down to take with you to confession.

Father will greet you and say "Let us begin in the name of the Father, and of the son, and of the Holy Spirit"

****Make the sign of the cross****

Say: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been ____ since my last confession."

****Read the sins on your paper from your examination of conscience****

When you are finished, say "For these and all my sins, I am truly sorry."

Listen to any advice Father may give you and pay attention to the penance.

When Father says, "Now make a good act of contrition," Say,

"Oh my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee and I detest all of my sins because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen"

Father will pray the prayer of absolution. "God the Father of mercies has reconciled the world to himself..."

Father will then say, "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good." at which you respond, "His mercy endures forever."

The priest then concludes by saying, "Your sins are forgiven. Go in peace." and you respond, "Thanks be to God."

****Exit the confessional, go to your pew and immediately pray your penance. ****


