John the Baptist's words in today's Gospel echoes across the whole of salvation history: "Behold, the Lamb of God."

For Israel, the image of the lamb was deeply familiar. At the very first Passover, a spotless lamb was sacrificed and its blood marked the doorposts, saving God's people from death and leading them out of slavery. Every year this was repeated as a memorial: lambs were offered again and again in the Temple as a sign of repentance and hope for reconciliation with God. Not only were the lambs sacrificed — for the rite to be complete, the lambs had to be consumed. Yet these sacrifices could only point forward; they could not fully take away sin.

When John sees Jesus and names Him the Lamb of God, he proclaims something strange to Jewish ears. John was saying that Jesus is the one who will take away the sins of the world. This doesn't make much sense until we get to the story of the cross which actually takes place during the feast of the Passover... the exact time that lambs were being sacrificed in the Temple. At calvary, Jesus is both priest and victim. He is the innocent Lamb who bears our sins and he is the priest who freely sacrifices his life to restore us to the Father.



But how do we receive this Lamb of God? In the Old Testament, the sacrifice was not complete until the lamb was eaten — and we know that sacrifice pointed to the New Covenant sacrifice: the Mass. Catholics really do have it all on Sundays (and every day where we attend the Holy Mass) as this Gospel comes alive! When the priest elevates the host and repeats John's words — "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world..." — we are placed at the same moment of revelation as John. We are invited to recognize that the same Jesus who stood before him, the same Jesus who offered His life on the cross, and the same Jesus who reigns as our eternal King is now truly present on the altar. The sacrifice once offered on the Cross is made present to us, to receive Him sacramentally in our very selves.

THIS WEEK'S QUESTION:

Q: "Do we have to be forgiven for a sin twice - once in the sacrament of reconciliation and again at death during particular judgment? If so, what is the value of the sacrament?"

A: This is an interesting question, and I am glad you took advantage of this opportunity to ask! The short answer to your question is "no" but I think it is important for us to unpack what the particular judgement is and what the sacrament of reconciliation is to get to the heart of your question.

The particular judgment happens immediately after death. At that moment, we stand before God and see our life clearly in the light of truth. God does not offer a new chance to repent then as our time of receiving God's grace is on earth. Rather, the judgment reveals whether we died in His friendship, that is, in a state of grace. Based on this, we enter Heaven (directly or through purgatory) or Hell. This judgement is the result of what we have freely chosen during our earthly life and is perfectly just (CCC 1022).

This is why the sacrament of reconciliation's value is immeasurable. When we commit mortal sin, we knowingly and freely turn away from God and break our friendship with Him. If we were to die unrepentant and without this sacrament, that separation would become eternal (Hell). In confession, however, when we sincerely repent and confess our sins, we hear the priest—acting in the person of Christ—say, "Through the ministry of the Church, I absolve you of all your sins..." At that moment, our sins are truly forgiven, and we are restored to God's grace.

Confession prepares us to meet the Lord with confidence and trust, knowing we have accepted His mercy which covers a multitude of sins. Even beyond forgiving mortal sins, this sacrament strengthens us, heals us, and helps us grow in holiness.

I hope this brings clarity and peace. Please feel free to ask any follow-up questions.

Joe Derico installed as Lector

Seminarian Joseph Derico was installed as a lector on Sunday, January 11, by His Eminence Fabio Cardinal Baggio at Immaculate Conception Chapel at the Pontifical North American College, in Rome.

The photos from the Pontifical North American College showcase this rite, including one of Joe receiving the Holy Scriptures - the Word of God.

Lectors are commissioned to proclaim the Word of God in the liturgical assembly and to instruct children and adults in the faith to prepare them to receive the sacraments.

Derico, who is from St. Patrick Church, Weston, WV, and his fellow seminarians, currently in their first year of theological formation for the priesthood, will have three additional years of theological, spiritual, and pastoral formation before being ordained to the priesthood in their home dioceses.

The Pontifical North American College serves as the American seminary in Rome. Founded in 1859 by Blessed Pius IX, the College has formed more than 5000 priests near the heart of the Church for service in

dioceses around the United States, Canada, and Australia. The College strengthens the bonds between Rome and local Churches worldwide, and it allows its students a first-hand encounter of the Church's rich religious and cultural heritage.


